D. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Pledge Leader – Mr. Jay Everson led the Board and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Hipple recognized Mr. John Wright, Planning Commission representative in attendance.

E. PRESENTATIONS

1. Presentation - Community Services

Mr. Vaughn Poller, Housing Administrator, and Ms. Rebecca Vinroot, Deputy Director of Social Services, addressed the Board giving a presentation on the programs and services offered by the Division of Social Services and the Division of Housing and Community Development.

As there were no questions for staff, Mr. Hipple thanked Mr. Poller and Ms. Vinroot for their presentation.

2. VDOT Quarterly Update

Mr. Rossie Carroll, Residency Administrator for the Williamsburg Residency, Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), addressed the Board giving an overview of the Quarterly Transportation Report included in the Agenda Packet.

Ms. Jones thanked Mr. Carroll for his attention to several issues in Westray Downs that she had discussed with him. She mentioned that Route 5, near the turns for Greensprings Road and Centerville Road, looks very distressed. She is not sure whose right-of-way those areas are, but there is also a damaged utility box. She also asked that he continue to monitor the ditches and culverts along Route 5, Greensprings Road, and Jamestown Road along the watershed.

Mr. Carroll stated that he would look into the issue and notify the corresponding utility company. He stated that they would continue to monitor the bridges and ditches along those areas.

Mr. McGlennon thanked Mr. Carroll for meeting with him last week to discuss several issues of concern in neighborhoods in his District. He stated that a constituent raised a concern regarding the intersection of Mounts Bay Road and Quarterpath Road. He asked that Mr. Carroll look into any safety concerns for that intersection.

Mr. Carroll stated that if it is the will of the Board for him to conduct a safety study for that area then he will certainly do so.

Mr. Onizuk thanked Mr. Carroll for the update on the projects on Monticello Avenue and Ironbound Road. He thanked all the residents of the Meadows for their patience as this project continues on toward completion. He asked where citizens can go to get more information about the current project.

Mr. Carroll stated that there is a project page on the Williamsburg Residency website where citizens can get more information about the project.

Mr. Kennedy stated that there still seems to be confusion as you come off the exit ramp from Route 199 onto Monticello Avenue. He saw two vehicles last week going the wrong direction and is concerned that one day there is going to be a fatality there. He also stated that on Route 60 East in the Lightfoot area, a utility company did some work and cut out a square in one of the lanes and now the asphalt does not match up with the rest of the roadway. People are swerving to avoid that patch, because it is like a giant pothole. He asked about the traffic study that was recently completed for the area around Stonehouse Elementary School.

Mr. Carroll stated that a safety study was completed first and some recommendations and actions were done to improve the safety of the intersection. Then a full traffic count and impact study was completed. It was found that the number of cars do not meet the national recommendation for warranting a traffic signal. However, they did go a step further and did some models of queuing and turn lanes to see what impact or benefit there would be of putting in a traffic signal. He stated that from those models they determined that a traffic signal would not make the area any safer and while it might reduce some of the angle crashes there would be an increase in rear-end collisions. They are going forward with some of the safety recommendations to help improve the flow and reduce some of the angle crashes.

Mr. Hipple requested that before the scheduled work is done in Chickahominy Haven that they check with the neighborhood about the date for Chickahominy Day. He stated that we would not want the work done on the Friday before the Saturday event with a whole lot people walking all over the recently sealed roads.

Mr. Jose Riberio, Senior Planner, addressed the Board giving an overview of the staff report included in the Agenda Packet.

As there were no questions for staff, Mr. Hipple asked Mr. John Wright to come forward and give the Planning Commission's recommendation.

Mr. Wright stated that the Planning Commission felt that the request was fairly straightforward and consistent with the conservation easement currently on the property. The Planning Commission approved the request by a vote of 7-0.

Mr. Hipple thanked Mr. Wright for their recommendation and opened the Public Hearing.

1. Mr. Will Holt, from Kaufman and Canoles, and representative of the applicant, addressed the Board stating that due to the straightforward nature of the case he did not intend to give a presentation, but rather asked if the Board had any questions that he or the applicant could answer.

Mr. Hipple asked if there were any questions for the applicant. Hearing none and with no one else registered to speak, Mr. Hipple closed the Public Hearing.

He stated that the event is a nationally televised event and the community support will be very important.

K. REPORTS OF THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

1. <u>County Administrator's Report</u>

Mr. Hill asked that the Board notify him of any questions or comments on his activity report. He announced that applications for the fall 2015 Good Neighbor Environment Matching Grant Program are due by 5 p.m., September 1, 2015. James City County community groups and homeowner associations are encouraged to apply for a grant award up to \$500. The program, sponsored by the James City Clean County Commission, enhances the sense of community through neighborhood involvement in the development and accomplishment of an environmentally sustainable neighborhood project. Categories are Physical Improvement/Sustainable Landscaping and Multi-Neighborhood Project Partnerships. The application is available at jamescitycountyva.gov/grants. Completed applications can be sent via email or submitted (six copies per application) to the James City County General Services

Department, Attention: Dawn Oleksy, 107 Tewning Road, Williamsburg, VA 23188. The grant awards will be announced on September 15.

Mr. Hill recognized Ms. Laura Messer, Tourism Coordinator, for developing the Top 10 Things to Do in James City County, which can be found on yesjamescitycountyva.gov. This is a great resource for citizens to find out what is going on throughout the community.

L. PUBLIC COMMENT

- 2. Mr. Howard Ware, 46 Whittacker's Mill, addressed the Board regarding the tax rate increase and the effect on the bond rating increase.
- 3. Mr. Chris Henderson, 101 Keystone, addressed the Board regarding the last Public Comment session at the previous meeting and cost and overruns for Fire Station 4 and Fire Station 1.

Mr. Hipple clarified that at the end of the previous meeting he was asking questions of Mr. Hill and not addressing specific individuals. He also noted that the Board discussed the current agenda layout during the Work Session earlier today and urged the citizens to go back and watch the video of the Board's discussion. He addressed some comments regarding Fire Station 1 and asked Mr. Hill to look into that. For the comments regarding the late bond payment, he as the Vice-Chair, Ms. Jones as the Chair, and Mr. Hill, were in the office discussing the issue. He stated that he is proud of this Board and while they do not always agree, they agree to disagree and still try to work together.

Mr. Hill stated that yes the comment about Fire Station 4 was correct. The Budget for that project was lower in FY 2012, but was increased in FY 2014. There were issues with property lines, drainage, and shared driveways that increased the overall cost of the project; however, the project did finish under the FY 2014 budgeted amount. He stated that he will look into the issue raised about the Wellington property. As for Fire Station 1, the project has not been completed yet and the property involved in that project was the Crawford House. He apologized to Mr. Henderson if he believed his email response to him last week was curt.

SUBJECT: Contract Award - Fire Station 1 Fuel Island Construction - \$293,258

Over the past two decades, the Division of Fleet and Equipment has utilized Jones & Frank for maintenance, repair, and construction of County fuel sites, fuel tank monitoring systems, and fuel transaction systems. Currently, the County has five fuel sites utilizing systems and service provided by Jones & Frank. Jones & Frank is the leading provider of these systems on the east coast. This new site at Fire Station 1 will incorporate the same controls and equipment as existing sites. This investment not only includes construction and equipment, but ensures uniformity as it relates to future maintenance and repairs.

Standardization reduces equipment downtime, improves response time, and customer service because dispensers, monitoring, and transaction systems will be the same at all facilities resulting in less time troubleshooting and diagnosing service issues. Finally, standardization promotes safety because staff members can rely on their previous experience and training when servicing the equipment.

The adopted Capital Improvements Program includes funding in FY 16 for engineering, construction, and installation of a "turnkey" fuel site. Jones & Frank previously provided a quote using a now expired contract with Newport News. The previous quote was used in the design and construction of the Fire Station 1 site improvements to establish electrical needs and layout of underground utilities as pertaining to a future fuel site. The goal is to provide a convenient and efficient means of obtaining fuel to all users in the area of Fire Station 1 and to expand County fuel capacity in the event of an emergency.

Fleet and Equipment, in consultation with the Purchasing Office, determined that Jones & Frank is the only source practicably available to engineer, construct, and install the fuel tanks, fuel island, and equipment. Jones & Frank submitted a proposed cost of \$293,257.98. The proposed rates have been determined to be reasonable through comparison to other County and neighboring county replacements and current construction cost indices.

Because this would be a sole source purchase over \$100,000, the Board of Supervisors approval is necessary.

Staff recommends approval of the attached resolution authorizing the sole source purchase of engineering, construction, and installation services from Jones & Frank in the amount of \$293,258 for the Fire Station 1 Fuel Island.

SUBJECT: Contract Award - Replacement Ambulance - \$248,785

The James City County Fire Department received a Rescue Squad Assistance Fund (RSAF) grant from the Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Health, Office of Emergency Medical Services to provide funding toward a replacement ambulance. The Board of Supervisors appropriated the grant on July 28, 2015.

The FY 2016 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) budget includes funds for the purchase of a replacement ambulance.

The Fire Department, Fleet, and Purchasing staff examined different options and determined the most efficient procurement method for this purchase is to use a cooperative purchasing contract issued by the Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC) to FESCO Emergency Sales as a result of a competitive sealed Invitation to Bid. The HGAC contract contains wording allowing other localities to purchase from the contract.

Cooperative procurement action is authorized by Chapter 1, Section 5 of the James City County Purchasing Policy and the Virginia Public Procurement Act. By participating in the cooperative procurement action, staff believes the County will increase efficiency, reduce administrative expenses, and benefit from an accelerated delivery process.

The HGAC Fire Service Apparatus cooperative contracts offer 20-plus vendors for rescue and fire apparatus. Base bid items are listed on the specific product pages. Almost all contracts include a wide array of additional configurations, optional equipment, and accessories that are available to allow localities to configure equipment/services to suit their unique requirements. These items were included with the contractor's bid/proposal response and are part of the recommended contract. James City County purchased replacement ambulances and pumper trucks 2010, 2012, 2013, and 2014 utilizing HGAC cooperative contracts.

The County could choose not to use the "co-op contract" provision and seek new bids. Seeking new bids would delay the award process and most likely result in higher prices. Purchasing recommends using the "co-op contract" provision, as analysis of market conditions (increased cost of manufacturing and raw materials) and comparison of pricing to other recent similar bids points to the County achieving good success with configuring our apparatus to meet the County's needs at a fair and reasonable cost. Additionally, the County has been able to standardize on a vehicle that is consistent with our current fleet and maintain optimum quality and performance.

Fire Department technical staff researched the design, construction, and field performance of the Horton medium-duty ambulance, worked closely with FESCO Emergency Sales to design a vehicle that will meet the Department's needs, and negotiated a price of \$248,785 for a replacement ambulance. The cost of the contract is within the funds allotted.

Contract Award - Replacement Ambulance - \$248,785 September 8, 2015 Page 2

The RSAF grant will fund \$124,687.50 of the purchase price. The remainder will be funded from the CIP budget for the replacement ambulance. CIP and RSAF funding will also be used for a power stretcher and power load system for the replacement ambulance. These items are not included in this contract. The County has achieved savings on these required items by purchasing them separately from the ambulance itself.

The new ambulance is intended for Fire Station 4. Final placement may differ based on call volume and the condition of other units at the time of delivery. The Fire Department will shift a current ambulance to a reserve status and take the oldest reserve unit out of service. The former ambulance may be sold or used elsewhere in the County in a non-emergency capacity.

Staff recommends adoption of the attached resolution authorizing contract award to FESCO Emergency Sales in the amount of \$248,785 for the Horton medium-duty ambulance.

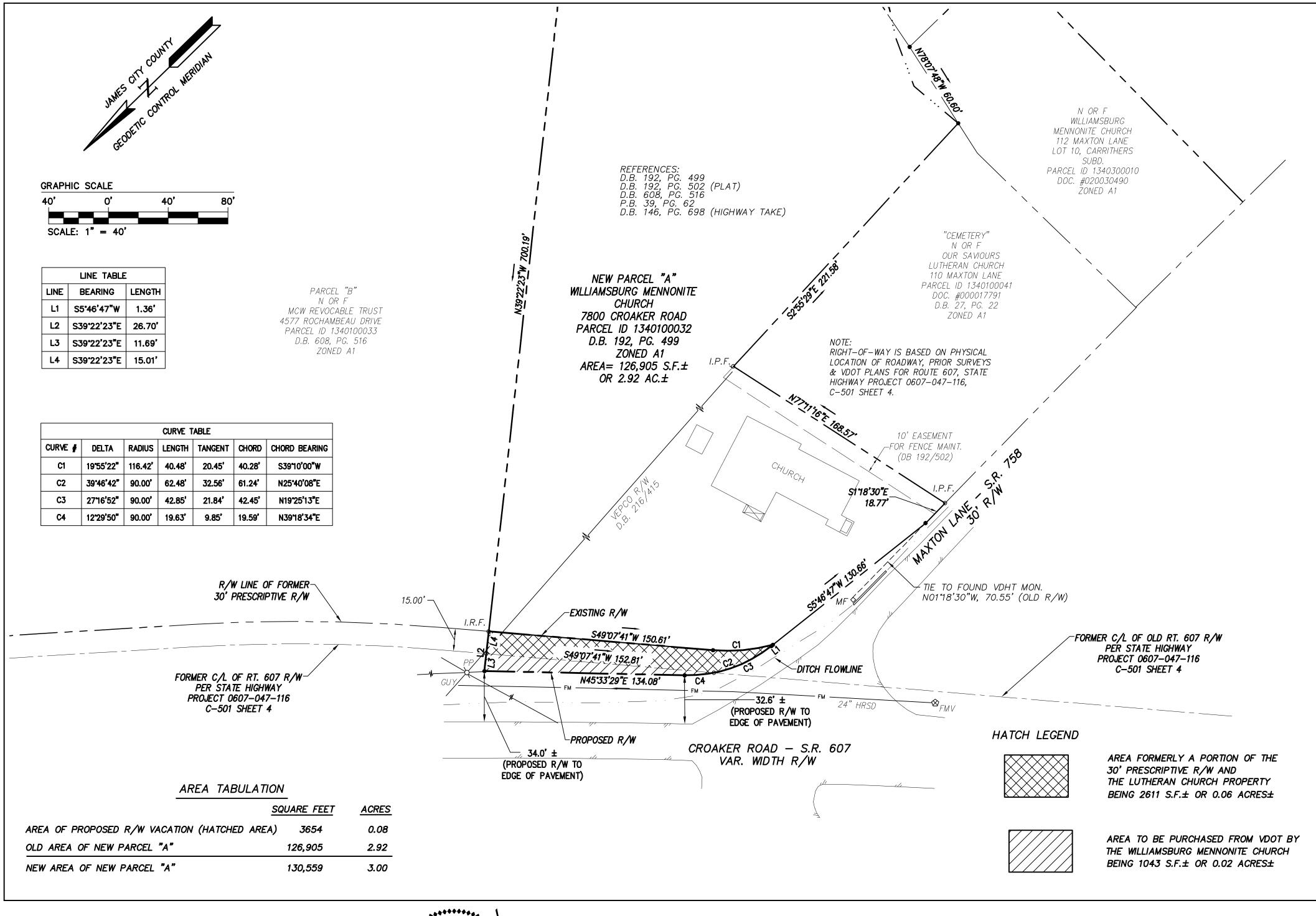

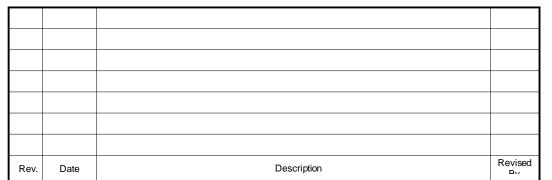

This project consists of video and audio equipment replacements to the Building F Board Room, Work Session room, and Broadcast Control room located at the Government Complex at 101-F Mounts Bay Road.

When Building F was constructed and opened in 2003, the installation of a Broadcast Control room, Board Room, and Work Session room cameras plus projection and audio systems were included. It has been 12 years since the original equipment was installed making the majority of video equipment obsolete with no available maintenance or replacement. In addition, since the Federal Communications Commission transition to HDTV transmission, the County's equipment is not 100 percent compatible with those changes.

This project will allow live meetings to be broadcast and played back in a 16x9 digital TV format. It will provide improved public address audio in the Board Room for the audience as well as cleaner audio on television monitors. The replacements will include new Production Switching, Digital Audio management, content recording, and a Control System user interface for all spaces plus replacement cameras for the Work Session room. This design will also include the infrastructure cabling for a future system replacement for microphones and displays to be done at a later date in the Work Session room.

Whitlock/Virginia Beach, Virginia, has been chosen as the contractor for the project. The company is a preapproved contractor under the Virginia Information Technology Agency's Contract #VA-110502-WHIT. Through value engineering and other negotiations, staff was able to negotiate a cost of \$265,000, roughly \$56,600 less than the approved FY 2016 Capital Improvements Program amount.

Staff recommends that the Board authorize the contract award for the Building F audio/video equipment replacement to Whitlock/Virginia Beach in the amount of \$265,000.

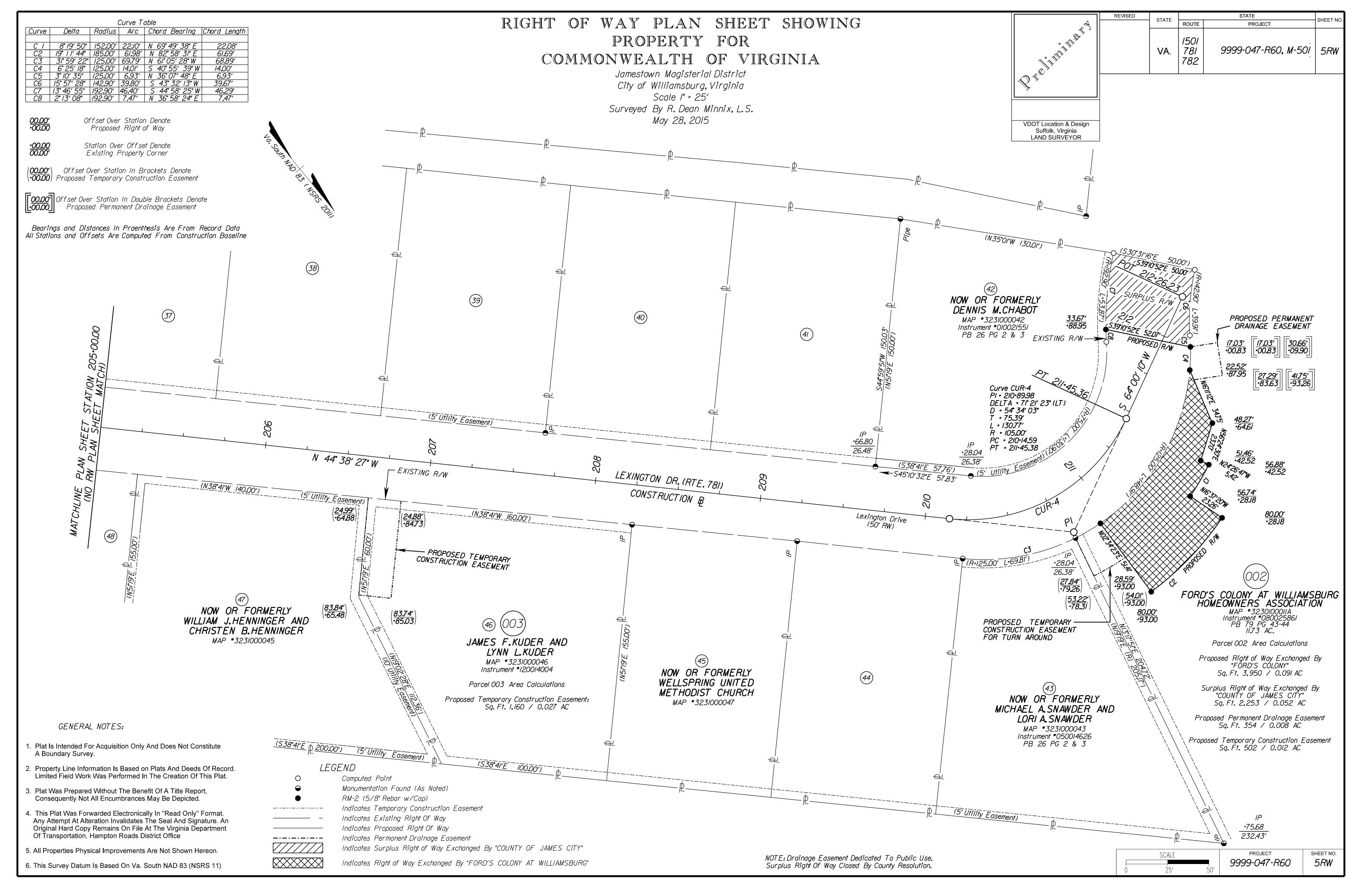

Estimate for an Active Project in the Williamsburg West Subdivision and Contingency

Transfer – Special Project Grants Fund - \$66,500

On November 13, 2012, the Board of Supervisors adopted several resolutions authorizing the County to participate in the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) FY 2014 Revenue Sharing Program, which provides jurisdictions an additional funding option to construct or improve the highway system. The program matches local dollars on a one-to-one basis up to \$10 million.

As a competitive program, VDOT prioritizes eligible projects into the following categories:

Priority 1 – Construction projects that accelerate project in the Six-Year Plan or in a locality's capital plan.

Priority 2 – Maintenance projects for poor surface quality roads as determined by VDOT's road condition indexes.

Priority 3 – Construction and maintenance projects that do not meet the above criteria.

Historically, the County has used the Revenue Sharing Program to provide funding for small projects, immediate needed improvements, or to supplement existing projects with minimal remaining balances.

One the of the projects supported by the Board of Supervisors in 2012, was the proposed reconstruction of Lexington Drive, Country Club Court, and Country Club Drive in the Williamsburg West subdivision for acceptance into the VDOT system for maintenance. These roads are in need of significant maintenance, but have never been improved to the point of being eligible to be maintained by VDOT. It is the County's policy to discourage private streets, as unaddressed maintenance problems can be detrimental to the welfare and safety of County residents.

At the time, VDOT estimated the anticipated scope of work would cost \$400,000 (\$200,000 VDOT cost; \$200,000 James City County cost).

VDOT and County staff subsequently completed the pre-scope work as well as multiple field inspections and the stormwater management plan for the new turnarounds. Further, based on the final design plan, all of the right-of-way, drainage easements and temporary construction easements required to complete the project were recently agreed to by all parties, including Ford's Colony at Williamsburg Homeowners Association, as documented more specifically in the companion paper located on this same Board Agenda.

Therefore, based on what is currently needed to reconstruct these roads and bring them up to current standards to be accepted by VDOT for maintenance, the project is now estimated by VDOT to cost \$593,000 (\$296,500 VDOT cost; \$296,500 James City County cost).

To cover the \$193,000 increase in the cost estimate:

- 1. \$60,000 (\$30,000 VDOT funds; \$30,000 James City County funds): Is available for transfer from another RevShare project which was subsequently cancelled (i.e., also in 2012, the Board authorized a RevShare project to install a right-in/right-out commercial entrance channelization island at the 7-Eleven at 4840 Longhill Road. This project was later determined by VDOT to be infeasible due to safety concerns). The James City County local funds related to this project are already set aside.
- 2. \$133,000: \$66,500 in VDOT funds are available for transfer from another RevShare project (i.e., Old News Road surface improvements were completed in 2013 as a RevShare project and was completed under budget). These remaining VDOT funds are available for transfer to the Williamsburg West project as long as the County can match these funds 1:1, as required by the program. \$66,500 in James City County local match funds would need to be set aside accordingly.

Staff therefore recommends the Board of Supervisors provide \$66,500 in matching funds from Contingency. If approved, sufficient funding will exist to allow VDOT to complete the project.

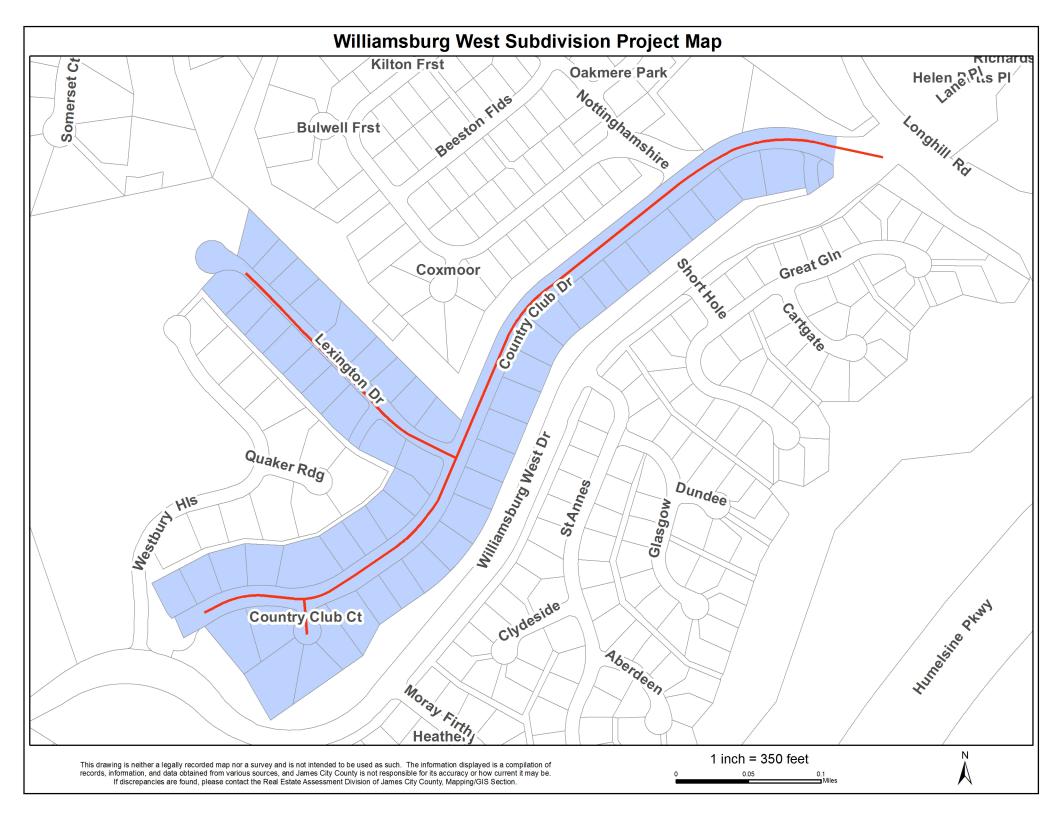

- WHEREAS, on November 13, 2012, the Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution authorizing the County to participate in the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) FY 2014 Revenue Sharing Program for the purpose of reconstructing Lexington Drive, Country Club Court, and Country Club Drive in the Williamsburg West subdivision for the purpose of making the roads eligible to be taken into the VDOT system for maintenance; and
- WHEREAS, the VDOT Revenue Sharing Program provides jurisdictions an additional funding option to construct or improve the highway system and matches local dollars on a one-to-one basis; and
- WHEREAS, in 2012 the preliminary scope of the project was estimated to cost \$400,000; and
- WHEREAS, the design of the project has now been completed and based on that final design all of the right-of-way, drainage easements, and temporary construction easements required to complete the project were agreed to by all parties; and
- WHEREAS, based on the completed design the project's cost is now estimated to be \$593,000; and
- WHEREAS, existing Revenue Sharing funds in the amount of \$60,000 are available for transfer from a cancelled project (entrance channelization island at the 7-Eleven at 4840 Longhill Road) and \$66,500 in existing VDOT Revenue Sharing funds are available from the remaining balance of another previously completed project (Old News Road surface improvements), which leaves a balance of \$66,500 in local match dollars necessary to fully fund this project.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of James City County, Virginia, hereby authorizes the transfer of \$66,500 from Contingency to the Special Project Grants Fund and appropriate to the Williamsburg West Revenue Sharing Project to cover the anticipated costs of this project.

SUBJECT: Resolution of Support for House Bill 2 Transportation Funding Applications

In 2013, House Bill 2313 was signed into law, creating a more sustainable revenue source supporting transportation funding. While passage of this bill enabled the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) to add approximately \$4 billion in funding to the six-year improvement program, there are still many transportation needs that cannot be addressed with available revenues.

To find a way to better balance transportation needs and prioritize investments for both urban and rural communities throughout the Commonwealth, new legislation - House Bill 2 (HB2) - was signed into law in 2014. HB2 requires the CTB to develop and implement a quantifiable and transparent prioritization process for making funding decisions for capacity - enhancing projects within the six-year improvement program.

The ultimate goal in the implementation of HB2 is to ensure the best use of limited transportation funds. Transparency and accountability are crucial aspects of this process. HB2 projects will be evaluated based on a uniform set of measures that are applicable statewide, while recognizing that factors should be valued differently based on regional priorities.

Generally, the prioritization process for the Hampton Roads District will evaluate projects in the following factor areas: congestion mitigation (45%), economic development (5%), accessibility (15%), safety (5%), environmental quality (10%), and land use coordination (20%).

The HB2 implementation process begins in August 2015, with projects initially selected by the CTB for inclusion in the draft Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP) by April 2016. The HB2 process does not cover all types of projects within the SYIP. There are many other sources of funding including maintenance and rehabilitation, safety, operations, and other Federal and State funding categories (e.g., Revenue Sharing, CMAQ, RSTP).

There are two main pathways to funding within the HB2 process – the Construction District Grant Program and the High-Priority Projects Program. These two grant programs were established under HB 1887, approved by the General Assembly in February 2015.

More specifically, HB1887 removes the transportation funding formula put in place by the 1986 Special Session legislation. HB1887 puts into place a new construction formula, which becomes fully effective in FY 2021.

HB1887 establishes the new transportation funding formula, specifically the State of Good Repair Program (45%), High-Priority Projects Program (27.5%), and Construction District Grant Program (27.5%). Both the High-Priority Projects Program and the Construction District Grant Program are subject to HB2.

The High-Priority Projects Program (as defined in § 33.2-370) refers to projects of regional or statewide significance that address a transportation need identified for a Corridor of Statewide Significance or a regional network in the VTrans2040 Multimodal Transportation Plan. In this program, projects and strategies are compared to projects and strategies submitted statewide. It is anticipated that \$500.1 million will be available in the six-year plan for this program.

The Construction District Grant Program (as defined in § 33.2-371) refers to projects and strategies solicited from local governments that address a need for a Corridor of Statewide Significance, regional network, improvements to promote urban development areas, or safety improvements identified in the VTrans2040 Multimodal Transportation Plan. In this program, candidate projects and strategies from localities within a highway construction district are compared against projects and strategies within the same construction district. It is anticipated that \$100.8 million will be available to the Hampton Roads District in the six-year plan for this program.

For both programs, projects and strategies are to be screened, evaluated, and selected according to the process established pursuant to HB2.

The following graphic was developed by VDOT to help show the relationship between the different pieces of legislation:

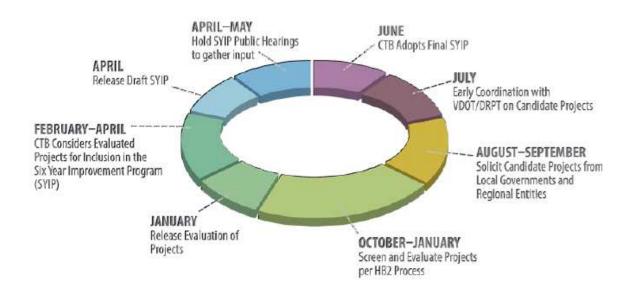
Life Cycle of a Candidate Project

Applications to VDOT for the HB2 process are due September 30 and localities must prioritize projects when more than one application is submitted.

This year, James City County intends to apply for HB2 funding for three significant projects.

- Longhill Road, Phase 1 (Priority #1). The Board of Supervisors recently adopted a Corridor Study and improvement plan for this roadway. The study provides a comprehensive understanding of the operational and capacity improvements along Longhill Road that are needed to accommodate existing and anticipated future growth and economic vitality within the study area and the County. This project involves implementing the recommendations of the study for Phase I, which is located between Route 199 and Olde Towne Road.
- Route 60 Relocated and Skiffes Creek Connector (Priority #2). These projects have long existed as a priority on James City County's Comprehensive Plan and represent a significant multijurisdictional project which will benefit a large portion of population on the Peninsula. These projects will not only open up large areas of industrial zoned land for new economic development, but will provide significant congestion relief for the Grove area of James City County, the Lee Hall area of Newport News, and Joint Base Langley-Eustis.
- Route 60 Multimodal Improvement Project (Priority #3). Much like the project above, the primary purpose of this project is to provide substantial congestion relief and to significantly improve safety along a 2.0+/- mile stretch of Route 60 (Pocahontas Trail) in James City County.

As the Route 60 Relocated and Skiffe's Creek Connector Project and the Route 60 Multimodal Improvement Project represent planned improvements to the East-West Corridor of Statewide Significance, James City County will also request the Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) provide a Resolution of Support for these two projects, as required by HB2, at their upcoming meeting on September 17.

Staff recommends the Board of Supervisors adopt the attached resolution expressing support for these projects being submitted through the upcoming HB2 cycle and endorsing the priority ranking of the submitted applications as noted.
