- 2. <u>Transfer of Sewerage Lift Station 1-2 to Hampton Roads Sanitation District</u>

RESOLUTION

TRANSFER OF SEWERAGE LIFT STATION 1-2 TO

HAMPTON ROADS SANITATION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the James City Service Authority owns Sewerage Lift Station 1-2 located off John Tyler Highway near Jamestown High School that was designed and constructed with the intent of eventual transfer to the Hampton Roads Sanitation District (HRSD); and

- WHEREAS, HRSD has agreed to accept the transfer of the facility when the manufacturer warranties on the equipment expire in April 2006.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, hereby authorizes the General Manager to sign the appropriate documents, transferring ownership of Sewerage Lift Station 1-2 to the HRSD.
- 4. Bid Award Route 199 College Creek Waterline Connection

<u>RESOLUTION</u>

BID AWARD - ROUTE 199-COLLEGE CREEK WATERLINE CONNECTION

- WHEREAS, the specifications to construct and install a waterline connection on Route 199 at the south end of the College Creek Bridge has been advertised and publicly opened; and
- WHEREAS, five firms submitted bids on the project with Wayjo Inc., who has been determined capable of performing the work associated with the project, submitting the lowest bid. Staff recommends awarding the Route 199-College Creek Waterline Connection project to Wayjo Inc., for a contract price of \$109,800.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, awards the bid for the Route 199-College Creek Waterline Connection to the firm submitting the lowest responsive bid - Wayjo, Inc., for \$109,800.
- 5. <u>Recalibration Implementation</u>

RESOLUTION

RECALIBRATION IMPLEMENTATION

- WHEREAS, a Recalibration Study to determine the competitiveness of James City Service Authority (JCSA) personnel salaries has been completed and new salary ranges and salary adjustments are recommended based on the information gathered in comparing JCSA compensation to that of other organizations; and
- WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the JCSA to implement the Recalibration as soon as possible to take advantage of the recommended Compensation Plan to attract and retain quality employees.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, authorizes the implementation of the Recalibration Study, effective April 1, 2006, and authorizes the needed budget amendments to cover the costs of the salary adjustments associated with implementing the plan in the Fiscal Year 2006 budget.

6. Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation Equipment Purchase Agreement

RESOLUTION

JAMESTOWN-YORKTOWN FOUNDATION EQUIPMENT PURCHASE AGREEMENT

- WHEREAS, the Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation (JYF) is designing a sewerage pumping station upgrade and replacement to accommodate increased flows resulting from activities associated with the 2007 Commemoration; and
- WHEREAS, the JYF and the James City Service Authority (Authority) staff have developed an agreement allowing the Authority to purchase specific equipment for the pumping station to ensure quality equipment, reduce inventory requirements, and facilitate similar James City Service Authority facilities for maintenance purposes; and
- WHEREAS, the agreement states that the Authority will provide the equipment to JYF's construction contractor and the JYF will reimburse the monies used to purchase the equipment.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, authorizes the General Manager to sign the agreement providing the terms for the equipment purchase and reimbursement described in this resolution.

3. <u>Contract Award – Facility Demolition Contract</u>

Mr. Goodson stated that he would abstain from voting due to potential conflict.

Mr. Harrison made a motion to adopt the item.

<u>RESOLUTION</u>

CONTRACT AWARD - FACILITY DEMOLITION CONTRACT

- WHEREAS; the James City Service Authority (JCSA) has publicly advertised and reviewed proposals from four firms interested in performing work associated with the demolition of eight facilities; and
- WHEREAS; the Board awarded the contract for the project to Canada Contracting Company, Inc., at its January 24, 2006, meeting, and it was later determined that Canada's safety record was no better than Macsons, Inc.; and
- WHEREAS; upon reevaluating the proposals to include the additional information regarding safety, staff determined that Macsons, Inc., submitted the most responsive and cost effective proposal.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, hereby rescinds its January 24, 2006, action awarding the contract for this project to Canada Contracting Company, Inc., and awards the contract for demolishing eight JCSA facilities as defined in the Request for Proposal documents to Macsons, Inc., for

\$129,300.

C. BOARD REQUESTS AND DIRECTIVES

Mr. Harrison inquired if there has been an impact to water usage this season due to the drought.

Mr. Foster stated that the County is starting the spring season with a 5-inch shortfall of precipitation and the James City Service Authority staff will be monitoring usage as we enter the peak season for water usage.

Mr. Foster stated that effective May 1, the regulations governing outdoor water usage are in effect, and reminds citizens that the regulations govern when people can water based upon house number and time of day.

Mr. Bradshaw reminded citizens that the amount of outdoor watering and fertilizer for lawns is far less than what is typically used.

D. ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Harrison made a motion to adjourn.

The motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.

SUBJECT: Authorizing the Conveyance of a 25-Foot Pathway and Private Easement Adjacent to Fieldstone Parkway in the Stonehouse Development in the Stonehouse District. The Easement is Defined in a Plat Dated September 6, 2005, Prepared by LandMark Design Group and is Located on Parcel No. 05030100014 at 9400 Fieldstone Parkway. The Easement Will be Used for the Location of Public Utilities and Sidewalk.

This item has been advertised as a public hearing on a proposal to transfer a 25-foot Pathway and Utility Easement to Fieldstone Investments, LLC.

Several years ago the developers of the Stonehouse Community transferred a parcel of property to the James City Service Authority (JCSA) that included a well facility. The Master Plan for the development included a major road adjacent to the parcel. The road is now under construction.

When the property was transferred, a Pathway and Utility Easement adjacent to the road was not designated on the Plat for the property by oversight. The current developer, Fieldstone, LLC, a subsidiary of Stonehouse, LLC, has requested that the JCSA designate the easement for use by the Stonehouse Community residents. The proposed easement will have no conflict with current or future JCSA plans for the easement area.

After receiving public comment, staff recommends that the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the General Manager to sign the appropriate documents designating the easement area as defined on the attached Plat.

<u>RESOLUTION</u>

AUTHORIZING THE CONVEYANCE OF A 25-FOOT PATHWAY AND PRIVATE EASEMENT ADJACENT TO FIELDSTONE PARKWAY IN THE STONEHOUSE DEVELOPMENT IN THE STONEHOUSE DISTRICT. THE EASEMENT IS DEFINED IN A PLAT DATED SEPTEMBER 6, 2005, PREPARED BY LANDMARK DESIGN GROUP AND IS LOCATED ON PARCEL NO. 05030100014 AT 9400 FIELDSTONE PARKWAY. THE EASEMENT WILL BE USED FOR THE LOCATION OF PUBLIC UTILITIES AND SIDEWALK.

- WHEREAS, the James City Service Authority (JCSA) was transferred a parcel and well facility many years ago by the developers of the Stonehouse Community; and
- WHEREAS, when the parcel was transferred, the designation of a 25-foot-wide Pathway and Utility Easement adjacent to Fieldstone Parkway was overlooked; and
- WHEREAS, Fieldstone Parkway adjacent to the well facility parcel is under construction and the developers have requested that the JCSA designate the easement area on the parcel as originally planned; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed easement area does not conflict with current or future plans of the JCSA.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, hereby authorizes the General Manager to sign the appropriate documents to designate a proposed 25-foot-wide Pathway and Utility Easement on Parcel No. 0530100014 adjacent to Fieldstone Parkway as defined on a Plat prepared by LandMark Design Group dated September 6, 2005.


