SUBJECT: Contract Award – Pipe Inspection Van and Camera Replacement - \$235,492

The FY 17 James City Service Authority (JCSA) Capital Improvement Program approved budget includes funds to replace a van equipped with a closed-circuit television pipe inspection system and camera that has reached the end of its service life.

JCSA and Purchasing staff examined different options and determined the most efficient procurement method for this purchase was to use a cooperative purchasing contract issued by the Houston Galveston Area Council (HGAC) to Rausch Electronics USA, LLC as a result of a competitive procurement process. The HGAC contract contains wording allowing other localities to purchase from the contract.

Cooperative procurement action is authorized by Chapter 1, Section 5 of the James City County Purchasing Policy and the Virginia Public Procurement Act. By participating in the cooperative procurement action, staff believes the JCSA will increase efficiency, reduce administrative expenses and benefit from an accelerated delivery process.

JCSA and Purchasing staff determined the HGAC cooperative contract includes the vehicle and camera equipment required by the Authority. Contract pricing for the items available through the contract totals \$235,492.

The cost of the contract is within the funds allotted.

Staff recommends adoption of the attached resolution authorizing the contract award to Rausch Electronics USA, LLC in the amount of \$235,492 for a replacement pipe inspection van and camera when funds become available on July 1, 2016.

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, hereby awards the contract for the replacement pipe inspection van and camera to Rausch Electronics USA, LLC in the amount of \$235,492 when funds become available on July 1, 2016.

Water - \$4,500

The James City Service Authority (JCSA) has been awarded a Wellhead Protection Grant by the Virginia Department of Health Office of Drinking Water in the amount of \$4,500. The grant funding sources are the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act and the Virginia Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Set-Asides.

The funds are to be used to properly abandon old, unused wells through the JCSA's Cap It Well Abandonment Program. Wells are abandoned when they are replaced by new wells or when homes are connected to the JCSA. Virginia law requires that private wells no longer in use be properly abandoned, which means that a licensed well driller permanently seals or "caps" the well. The Cap It Program provides funding and information to assist citizens in capping wells.

The purpose of the Cap It Program is to protect James City County's groundwater resources from pollutants and contamination via unused or improperly abandoned private wells in James City County, protect the Chesapeake Bay and local rivers and watersheds by reducing the threat of groundwater contamination, and reduce the threat to humans and animals that may become trapped in an open, unused well.

Over the past 13 years, over 290 wells have been abandoned through this program. County residents and businesses are eligible for the program with residential applications taking priority. The program currently has a waiting list of 14 applications.

The grant requires no match.

Staff recommends adoption of the attached resolution.


