TO THE DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT
TO THE CHAIRMAN OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
TO THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD

My dear Sir:

We will prepare at the earliest possible moment a digest of the school code passed in the closing days of the General Assembly. For your immediate guidance in presenting your budget to the board of supervisors, please let me advise, as follows:

1. Boards of supervisors are authorized to levy a county tax for the establishment and operation and maintenance of the public schools. In their discretion they may levy a district tax for debts peculiar to the district and for capital outlays.

Of course, the purpose of this law is to encourage the county as the financial unit as well as the administrative unit. While the code does not go into effect until your boards have laid levies for the next school year, yet this is the situation. Under the previous law a board was urged to lay a county levy for operation and maintenance, but might, in its discretion, lay a district levy in part for this purpose. Under the new law the district levy is strictly limited to debts peculiar to the district and in the discretion of the board to capital outlays. Since therefore under the old law operation and maintenance might be provided for exclusively by the county tax, and under the new law it must be provided for, it would seem to me quite proper to urge the boards of supervisors to take care of all maintenance, operation, instruction and control through the county fund.

2. Please let me emphasize that the new law provides that boards of supervisors may make cash appropriations instead of any levy. I would suggest that you urge the board of supervisors to make a general county levy from which a direct appropriation would be made to the public schools rather than to levy a separate and distinct school tax.

In this fashion you will know precisely what amount of money you may count upon and can set up your operating budget quite definitely.

3. Let me advise too that the new law provides that all school accounts must be kept in strict accordance with an accounting system to be set up by the Comptroller's Office and this Department. These forms will be prepared so that all accounting for the year beginning July first can be set up in accordance with these forms.

4. In reference to the State fund for next year, please be advised that you should receive an increase at the rate of approximately ninety-seven cents (97 cents) per pupil of school age in your division. You will not receive for next year any special appropriation from the one-third inheritance tax heretofore returned to the county, the amount of said inheritance tax being estimated in the general increase voted by the last Assembly.

Accredited area regulations governing the importation of cattle into a County.

REGULATION 1. No cattle shall be imported, or brought in, or allowed to enter the quarantined area except in accordance with the following rules.

RULE 1. Cattle that have passed one official tuberculin test.

RULE 2. Cattle for immediate slaughter may enter the quarantined area to be slaughtered within ten days of such entry, and during this ten day interval they must be kept separate from other cattle.

RULE 3. Steers, range cattle (a) and semi-range cattle (b) of recognized beef type may enter the quarantined area for feeding and grazing purposes under special quarantine, and confined separate from other cattle on the premises of the owner, or on such other premises as may be designated in the order of special quarantine.

(a) Range cattle are considered to be those of the beef breeds or type which are raised practically without shelter on range areas and which subsist chiefly or entirely by grazing on natural vegetation.

(b) Semi-range cattle are considered to be those of the beef breeds or type which are raised partly on the range and partly under farm conditions to the extent of receiving feed besides natural vegetation and also care for shelter not ordinarily provided for range cattle.

RULE 4. Bull calves under six (6) months old of recognized beef type may enter the quarantined area for feeding and grazing purposes under separate quarantine according to Rule 3, provided such calves are castrated within ten (10) days after arrival at point of destination.

RULE 5. All cattle other than those described in Rules 1, 2, 3, 4, must be subjected to an official tuberculin test before entering the above described quarantined area.




WHEREAS, there has been introduced in the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States a bill providing for the creation of the Colonial National Monument, being House Bill #8424 and known as the "Cramton Bill"; and

WHEREAS, Section 3 of the said bill provides that the Secretary of the Interior shall have the power to condemn private property in the Jamestown, Williamsburg and Yorktown areas, leaving to him the defining of such areas, for the uses therein mentioned; and



At a meeting of the James City County Board of Health held at James City County Court House on the 13th day of May, 1930, the following resolution was adopted.

WHEREAS, the James City County Board of Health deems it necessary that Chap. 465, Acts of Assembly, 1924, as amended by Chapter 500, Acts of Assembly 1926, shall be enforced in James City County, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That said Chapter as amended, reading as follows, be and it hereby is enforceable in James City County:

Chap. 465, Acts of Assembly, 1924, An Act to regulate the disposal of human waste or excreta within the Commonwealth of Virginia and to provided penalties; as amended by an Act approved March 25, 1926:

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia, That in any City or

incorporated town of the State and for a radius of one-half mile beyond the corporate limits thereof and elsewhere in the State whenever the Local Board of Health shall deem it necessary, it shall be unlawful for the owner of any house or other building to be used as a human habitation to occupy or to rent or lease the same for occupancy by any person, firm or corporation, or for any person, firm or corporation to occupy the same until the said house shall have been supplied with a sanitary privy or closet of such form as to comply with the law, If any landlord shall fail to supply any house of his with a sanitary privy or closet as required by this act, his tenant shall supply the same in conformity with the orders of a health officer or health inspector and may deduct the cost thereof from any sum due the landlord for rent.

2. That it shall be unlawful to maintain or to rent or lease any recreation or construction camp or camping place for tourists, to use any building for educational purposes, or to permit the use of any building or tent for protracted meetings until such camps or buildings are supplied with sanitary closets or privies.

3. That for the purpose of this act a "sanitary closet or privy" is deemed to be only any one which provides for the disposal of human waste or excrements in such manner that they shall not be accessible to flies or obviously endanger a source of drinking water.

4. That it shall be unlawful for any tenant or lessor of a premises properly supplied with such a sanitary privy or closet to neglect it or to allow it to cease to be sanitary within the meaning of the act.

5.
