**B. WORK SESSION - FY 1985 PROPOSED BUDGET**

John McDonald provided a brief overview of the proposed FY 85 budget. Alan MacDonald led a review of FY 85 revenues. Mr. Brown noted that if funds were available he would like a 10% reduction in the assessment on automobiles.

The Board asked for additional information on the following:

1. Expenditures in FY 1983 for legal services.
2. Across the board expenditures for the following expense items: Dues, Memberships, Subscriptions; Travel and Conferences; Professional Services; and Publications.
3. Copy of the County Pay Scale.
4. Staff reaction to an Internal Auditor position.
5. Economic Development - Implementation of the Skiffe's Creek Industrial Area Study Recommendations.
6. Police Department - Financial impact in FY 86 of positions proposed to be added January 1, 1985.
7. Door-to-door surveying by Animal Control.
8. Gap between fees and expenses in Code Enforcement.
9. Community Services Budget.

Mr. Fraser Neiman, representing the Williamsburg Regional Library and Cultural Center, read a prepared statement concerning State aid to the Library. He also distributed a "Comparison of Usage and Support" chart for Williamsburg, James City County, and York County, covering the period 1981-1984.

Mr. Brown requested additional information (in the next BOS Reading Materials) on the Festival Williamsburg Limited and Williamsburg's proposed contribution to that organization.

Mr. Mahone moved the nomination of Abram Frink to the Williamsburg Recreation Commission.
