

AT A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF JAMES CITY, VIRGINIA, AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLIAMSBURG, REGARDING THE COURTHOUSE HELD ON THE 10TH DAY OF OCTOBER, NINETEEN HUNDRED NINETY-FOUR, AT 7:34 P.M., IN THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT CENTER BOARD ROOM, 101 MOUNTS BAY ROAD, JAMES CITY COUNTY, VIRGINIA.

B. PRESENTATION

Mr. DePue presented a brief overview of the purpose of this Special Meeting. He called upon Mr. Edwards to make a presentation on the Courthouse agreement. Mr. Edwards outlined the agreement to develop the courthouse on a tract of land within the Casey Property, adjacent to Ironbound Road and the future Monticello Avenue Extension.

At 7:43 p.m., Mr. DePue opened the Public Hearing to receive comments on the proposed courthouse.

1. Mr. Sam Hazelwood, Toano, stated that he liked the site due to its proximity to the upper end of James City County and the future James City County growth pattern but was opposed to giving the building to the City since James City County would provide the bulk of the funding.
2. Mr. Charles Washington, 105 Brookhaven Drive, spoke to his concerns regarding traffic on Ironbound Road and who would control future growth of the Casey tract.
3. Mr. John T. P. Horne, Development Manager, was called upon by Mr. DePue to address traffic impacts and the proposed construction of Route 199 and Ironbound Road.
4. Mr. Al Whitehome, 216 Fairfax Way, commended the Committee for its work and hoped that this would become a future center for the overall Williamsburg community and suggested that the County look for public investment in the area on a regional basis.
5. Richard Costello, 10020 Sycamore Landing Road, stated that it was a good site and asked what would happen to the existing courthouse.

6. Mr. Robert Gilley, 227 Gatehouse Boulevard, stated that he did not like the Courthouse moving into the City since James City County was paying the majority of the cost.

7. Mr. Al Johnson, 118 Brookhaven Drive, stated that he desired not to have a flat roof on the Courthouse.

There being no further speakers. Mr. DePue closed the public hearing at 8:02 p.m.

The Board and the City Council discussed design cost, control of Monticello Road extended, and issues dealing with land development in this area of James City County.

Mayor McConnell spoke to why the City felt it was important for the Courthouse to be in the City.

Various Board and Council members thanked the Committee for its work.

Mr. DePue made a motion to approve the Courthouse Resolution.

On a roll call, the vote was: AYE: Magoon, Edwards, Sisk, DePue (4). NAY: Taylor (1).

On a roll call vote, the City Council also approved the resolution.

COUNTY OF JAMES CITY AND CITY OF WILLIAMSBURG


RE: COURTHOUSE
