1. Self-Sufficiency Program, Community Services

Mr. Anthony Conyers, Jr., Community Services Manager, and staff presented details of the County's Self-Sufficiency Program.

G. PUBLIC HEARINGS1. Proposed FY 96 Budget

Mr. John E. McDonald, Manager of Financial and Management Services, stated that the public hearings were to solicit citizen comments to the proposed budget and tax rate for FY 96. He introduced Carol Davis, Assistant Manager of Financial and Management Services, who gave a presentation on the proposed budget.

Mr. DePue opened the public hearing.

1. Mr. M. D. "Gabby" Galbreath, III, 113 Deerwood Drive, spoke in opposition to the proposed budget and suggested cutting budget to offset the proposed one-cent tax increase, do not increase last year's budget, and sell County-owned surplus land and use proceeds to purchase the courthouse site.

2. Mr. Ed Oyer, 139 Indian Circle, spoke in opposition to several parts of the proposed budget; tax rate increase of one-cent, School budget, 911 tax increase of \$.30, personal property tax on 100 percent of vehicle loan value, expansion of Government Center, moving of Fire Station No. 2, and compensation study salaries.

3. Mr. Philip Emerson, Executive Director, Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation, asked for County support of Jamestown Settlement.

Mr. Edwards made a motion to approve the amended resolution.

Mr. DePue closed the public hearing.

2. Proposed Tax Rate

Mr. McDonald stated the proposed increase in the real estate tax rate was from current 83 cents per \$100 assessed value to 84 cents for FY 96.

Mr. DePue opened the public hearing, and as no one wished to speak, he closed the public hearing.

3. Case Nos. Z-1-95 and SUP-3-95. Williamsburg Honda and Jeep Dealership (continued from April 3, 1995)

Mr. Mark J. Bittner, Planner, stated that the applicant had requested deferral of these cases at the April 3, 1995, Board of Supervisors' meeting.

Mr. Bittner further stated that Mr. John E. Dodson of CEMS had applied to rezone approximately 6 acres from LB, Limited Business, to B-1, General Business, for expansion of Williamsburg Honda and Jeep Automobile Dealership, located at 7277 Richmond Road, further identified as Parcel No. (1-36) on James City County Real Estate Tax Map No. (23-2).

Mr. Bittner stated the applicant had met with adjacent residents regarding the proposed berm and buffers and that discussion was ongoing.

Staff determined that while the land use designation was inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan, that use would compare favorably with what otherwise might be permitted.

In concurrence with staff, the Planning Commission unanimously approved the applications with conditions listed in the resolution.

Mr. DePue opened the public hearing.

1. Mr. John E. Dodson, principal of dealership at 7277 Richmond Road, explained the expansion in detail and expressed a willingness to listen to reasonable conditions.

2. Mr. Daniel Avery, 118 Nina Lane, expressed concerns that conditions be required on the applications to protect homes, quality of life and property values in the neighborhood. He asked for consideration of no auto body repair shop and no additional buildings built within 250 feet of the James City Service Authority well lot.

3. Mr. Ed Oyer, 139 Indian Circle, noted changes have occurred in performing auto body repairs and in the composition of auto paint.

Board discussion followed regarding a proffered concept plan, adequate screening of property, height of lighting, monitoring of decibel levels, and setting performance measures if needed.

Without Board objection, Mr. DePue deferred the cases to a future meeting to allow additional discussion and review.

Mr. DePue declared a break at 9:55 p.m.

Mr. DePue reconvened the Board into open session at 10:02 p.m.

4. Case No. SUP-9-95. Williamsburg Crossing Master Plan Amendment (continued from April 3, 1995)

Mr. Bittner stated that Mr. Calvin Davis of University Square Associates had requested deferral of the case because Mr. Alvin Anderson, Esq., his representative, was unable to attend.

Mr. DePue opened the public hearing.

1. Mr. Drew A. Swank, 112 Winston Drive, spoke in opposition to expansion of Williamsburg Crossing Shopping Center because of noise, construction traffic, lowering value of homes, and neighborhood completely circled by shopping centers.

Mr. Magoon stated that he had met with Mr. John Brendel, whose property abuts the shopping center, and urged Mr. Swank to contact Mr. Brendel for information about involvement by other interested Winston Terrace residents.

Without Board objection, Mr. DePue deferred the case for further discussion and review.

5. Ordinance Amendment, Chapter 2, Administration, Article II, Magisterial District, Election Districts and Election Precincts, Section 2-4, Precinct and Polling Places, and Section 2-5, District Boundaries (continued from March 20, 1995)

Mr. Frank M. Morton, III, County Attorney, stated that the Electoral Board had requested the Powhatan and Stonehouse Election Districts be split.

Staff recommended approval of the ordinance, after which the changes would be submitted to the United States Department of Justice for approval under the Voting Rights Act of 1968.

Mr. DePue opened the public hearing, and as no one wished to speak, he closed the public hearing.

Mr. DePue made a motion to approve the ordinance.

6. Ordinance Amendment, Chapter 11, Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Article IV, Vehicle Decals, Section 11-53, Decal Requirements and Section 11-59, Decal Available for Sale (continued from March 20, 1995)

Mr. Morton stated the proposed ordinance would provide a 30-day grace period for all residents of the County to acquire a County decal and would require an applicant for a decal to provide the Commissioner of the Revenue the original or accurate copy of the permanent State vehicle registration.

Mr. DePue made a motion to approve the ordinance amendment.

Mr. Sisk made a motion to appoint Mr. Anthony Conyers, Jr., to the Williamsburg Area Medical Assistance Corporation for a one-year term, term expiring April 1, 1996.

J. BOARD REQUESTS AND DIRECTIVES

Mr. Magoon asked staff to make recommendation to study drainage issues in County and include Senator Thomas K. Norment, Jr., and Delegate George W. Grayson in discussion.

Mr. DePue asked staff to pursue independent drainage analysis of Fieldcrest and Gatehouse Farms subdivisions, and cost and process of Master Plan for Greensprings Road area, and bring back at mid-May Board of Supervisors' meeting.

Mr. DePue asked the Board to E-mail its questions to staff regarding value of road and infrastructure improvements and tax revenue losses from Hampton Road Sanitation District composting facility, and asked staff to readvertise when bringing case back to Board.

Mr. DePue expressed abhorrence at anti-Semitic graffiti in a neighborhood in Powhatan District and urged citizens to condemn such actions.

Mr. DePue recessed the Board until Tuesday, April 18, 1995, at 7:00 p.m. for a Budget Work Session.

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ORDINANCE NO. 55A-19BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
JAMES CITY COUNTY
VIRGINIA

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REORDAIN CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION, OF THE CODE OF THE COUNTY OF JAMES CITY, VIRGINIA, BY AMENDING ARTICLE II, MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT, ELECTION DISTRICTS AND ELECTION PRECINCTS, BY AMENDING SECTION 2-4, ELECTION PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES ESTABLISHED; AND SECTION 2-5, ELECTION DISTRICT BOUNDARIES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of James City, Virginia, that Chapter 2, Administration, is hereby amended and reordained by amending Section 2-4, Election precincts and polling places established; and Section 2-5, Election district boundaries.

Chapter 2. Administration

Article II. Magisterial District, Election Districts
and Election Precincts.

Section 2-4. Election precincts and polling places established.

(a) Pursuant to authority contained in the Code of Virginia, Sections 24.1-37 through 24.1-39, the precincts and their respective polling places for the county are hereby created and established as set forth in this section.

(b) The precincts for each election district and the polling place for each precinct shall be as set forth below:

Berkeley Election District: Berkeley Precinct--James City County-Williamsburg Recreation Center
polling place.

Jamestown Election District:

Jamestown Precinct A--Clara Byrd Baker Elementary School polling place.

Jamestown Precinct B--Rawls Byrd Elementary School polling place.

Roberts Election District:

Roberts Precinct A--Mt. Gilead Baptist Church polling place.

Roberts Precinct B--James River Elementary School polling place.

Powhatan Election District:

Powhatan Precinct A--D. J. Montague Elementary School polling place.

Powhatan Precinct B--Norge Elementary School polling place.

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Stonehouse Election District:

Stonehouse Precinct A--Toano Middle School polling place.

Stonehouse Precinct B--York River Baptist Church polling place.

Section 2-5. Election district boundaries.

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line of parcel (32-4) (1-31) for approximately 900 feet to the centerline of State Route 612; thence northerly following the centerline of State Route 612 to its intersection with a tributary of Longhill Swamp located approximately 1,200 feet north of State Route 1530; thence northeasterly following the centerline of this tributary to its intersection with a 200-foot wide utility easement; thence northerly following the centerline of the utility easement to its intersection with State Route 614; thence westerly following the centerline of State Route 614 to its intersection with State Route 611; thence northwesterly following the centerline of State Route 611 to its intersection with State Route 632; thence northerly following the centerline of State Route 632 to the point of beginning.





AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REORDAIN CHAPTER 11, MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, OF THE CODE OF THE COUNTY OF JAMES CITY, VIRGINIA, ARTICLE IV. VEHICLE DECALS, BY AMENDING SECTION 11-53, DECAL REQUIRED; AND SECTION 11-59, APPLICATION; WHEN DECAL AVAILABLE FOR SALE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of James City, Virginia, that Chapter 11, Motor Vehicles and Traffic, is hereby amended and reordained by amending Section 11-53, Decal required; and Section 11-59, Application; when decal available for sale.

Chapter 11. Motor Vehicles and Traffic

Article IV. Vehicle Decals

Section 11-53. Decal required.

- (a) Every person owning a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer normally garaged, stored or parked in the county shall pay a license fee by procuring an annual county motor vehicle decal.

In the event it cannot be determined where such motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer is normally garaged, stored or parked, the situs for the motor vehicle decal or license requirement shall be the domicile of the owner of such motor vehicle. For the purposes of this article, "motor vehicle, trailer and semitrailer" shall be defined in accordance with Section 46.2-100 of the Code of Virginia.

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(b) The following shall be the duty of persons taking residence in county:

- (1) A nonresident or non-domiciled owner of a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer shall, upon taking residence or becoming domiciled in the county, procure a county motor vehicle decal within thirty (30) days. ~~There shall be no grace period between the original purchase of a state license and the purchase of a county motor vehicle decal; except that owners moving to the county from elsewhere in the state not requiring a local decal or license shall be entitled to a thirty (30) day period of grace.~~

State law reference - Authority of counties to license motor vehicles, etc., and provisions relating thereto,
Code of Va., §§ 46.1-65, 46.1-66.

- (2) Owners moving to the county from elsewhere in the state where a local decal or license was required, who at the time of moving to the county had obtained a local decal or license from that jurisdiction for the current year, shall obtain a current county motor vehicle decal and display it in accordance with the provisions of this article. Upon proof of purchase of a current motor vehicle decal or license from such other jurisdiction, the office of the county treasurer shall provide those newly moving into the county with the one-time courtesy of a county motor vehicle decal free of charge for that decal year. Upon expiration of the aforesaid local decal or license from another jurisdiction, and in all successive years in which the owner remains a resident of or domiciled in James City County, unless otherwise excepted, a current county motor


vehicle decal shall be obtained for each decal year in accordance with the provisions of this article.

- (c) Every purchaser of a new or used motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer which will be normally garaged, stored or parked in the county shall have ~~ten (10)~~ *thirty* days from the date of purchase to procure a county motor vehicle decal.

Section 11-59. Application; when decal available for sale.


- (a) Application for a county motor vehicle decal shall be made at the office of the county commissioner of the revenue or at any other location designated by him, on forms provided for the name and address of the applicant and a description of the motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer for which the decal is to be issued.
- (b) *An applicant for a decal shall provide the commissioner of the revenue the original or an accurate copy of the permanent State vehicle registration.*
- ~~(b)~~ (c) County motor vehicle decals shall be available for sale in the office of the county treasurer, or at any location designated by him, on January fifteenth of each year.
