### B. PRESENTATION

# 1. Small Business Assistance Strategy

Mr. Sanford B. Wanner, County Administrator, introduced Mr. Keith Taylor, Director of Economic Development, who detailed the strategy on how to be more effective in guidance and support of small business. He further stated that the assistance strategy stressed improved customer service, communication, access to statistical information and other market research tools, education, and improved quality and availability of labor.

# C. PUBLIC COMMENT

- 1. Mr. John Lott, 909 Wood Duck Commons, expressed concerns about drainage from the new Quail's Ridge development, who owned common ground between Season's Trace and Quail's Ridge, and asked why three lots (one of which he owned) bordering the development were not shown on the plans nor notified about the development.
- 2. Ms. Linda Tiexeira, 904 Wood Duck Commons, requested no further work be done in Quail's Ridge development until concerns for buffer areas, lot lines, and impacts of drainage on homes already built in Season's Trace were addressed.
  - Mr. John T. P. Horne stated that staff would conduct a review and respond to the citizens' questions.

# D. MINUTES - February 10, 1998

Mr. Edwards asked if there were additions or corrections to the minutes.

Mr. McGlennon made a motion to approve the minutes.

### E. HIGHWAY MATTERS

Mr. Quintin Elliott, Williamsburg Resident Engineer, Virginia Department of Transportation, gave an update on projects and on Route 199 construction schedules.

Mr. Elliott stated that the Grove interchange was underway with expected completion by the end of 1999. He gave completion dates estimated for segments of Route 199 as June 1999 - Route 60 to Longhill Road, with new Longhill Road completion October 1998; Longhill Road to Ironbound Road - June 1999, with some sections opened in conjunction with retail businesses; Route 5/Route 199 now between Phase 3 and Phase 4, with striping to be done when weather permitted and June 1999 as completion date. He emphasized that some reconfiguration and additional lanes on Route 5 at Williamsburg Crossing Shopping Center would also be constructed.

Mr. Edwards asked how a delay in contracts would affect the opening schedule for Route 199.

Mr. Nervitt asked how the Jamestown Road (Route 31)/Route 199 intersection would be affected upon completion of Route 199.

Mr. Horne responded that an analysis had been planned to be completed this year by Hampton Roads Planning District Commission on the Route 31/Route 199 intersection, which is in the City of Williamsburg.

Mr. Bradshaw requested continuation of seeking a solution to pedestrian concerns on Route 60 in Toano; requested striping on Riverview Road (Route 606) from Croaker Road (Route 607) to Newman Road (Route 646); asked that drainage be checked on Route 30 at New Kent County line and at Diascund Reservoir Road Dam, and an erosion problem from highway drainage one-quarter mile north of Anderson's Corner on Route 30.

Mr. Nervitt asked for litter clean up along roads in the County, giving examples of Centerville and Jolly Pond Roads.

Mr. Edwards asked if a Board member wished to remove any items from the Consent Calendar.

Mr. Bradshaw requested the removal of Item No. 1. He stated that he would abstain from the vote for conflict of interest due to representation of a client.

Mr. Larry M. Foster, General Manager, James City Service Authority, stated that water supply was of great concern and limited supply in James City County and the Peninsula due to growth. He further stated that a decision on King William Reservoir would not be made for possibly two years and tremendous energy, effort, and resources would be needed to continue to seek alternative solutions.
