RE: CASE #73-4 - WILLIAM J. BULL

Mr. Bull presented his case and explained that the property described in the above styled case has on it a partially constructed single family dwelling located in violation of front setback requirements of the County Zoning Ordinance. Further, Mr. Bull explained that the original contractor has discontinued construction of the dwelling in 1971, and had since declared bankruptcy. Mr. Bull advised that Mr. & Mrs. F. O. Robertson, had purchased the property from the Court and desired to complete construction of the dwelling. To obtain a new building permit, a variance from the terms of the County Zoning Ordinance was necessary.

Mr. Watkins, Zoning Administrator, advised that this application was legal and that the Robertson's closing attorney had advised him that with a variance granted by the Board of Zoning Appeals, could give clear title of the property to the Robertsons.

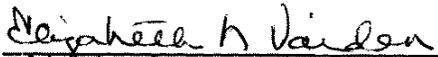
There being no further comments, the hearing for Case #73-4 was closed.

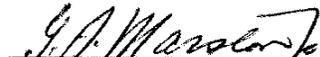
RE: NEW BUSINESS
