"WHEREAS, the Committee heretofore appointed to consider the advisability of the appointment of a Planning Commission for James City County filed its report at the regular March meeting, wherein it was strongly recommended that such a Commission be appointed and certain urgent matters concerning the welfare of the County were suggested for immediate reference to such Commission; and

"WHEREAS, the Members of this Board being of the opinion that the appointment and formation of such a body would be of great assistance to them in promoting the welfare and progress of the County and Community:

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a Planning Commission for James City County be and the same is hereby appointed and created in accordance with the provisions of Sections 15-916 to 15-926, both inclusive of the Virginia Code, which Commission shall be charged with the duties and have the authority and powers as are provided by law, and shall consist of one member of this Board and six additional members; each appointed to serve for four years or until his successor has been appointed and the said Commission, when appointed, is requested to give early consideration to the several suggestions contained in the report of said Committee, and the ways, means and feasibility of co-operating with the City of Williamsburg in

a joint Master Plan, or in the adoption of a separate Master Plan that will best serve the mutual interests, welfare and development of the City, County, and Community."
