C. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** – The following minutes were offered for approval: November 15, 2011 – Regular meeting of the SPAC– there was no discussion and minutes were approved.

D. STAFF UPDATES -

- a. **January 17, 2012 Meeting Summary-** Fran Geissler gave a brief summary of the meeting on January 17. It was not an official meeting as there was no quorum of eligible SPAC voting members.
- b. Chesapeake Bay TMDL Update -Fran Geissler passed out two handouts summarizing the County's Chesapeake Bay TMDL Watershed Implementation Plan, Phase II, submission to DCR, consisting of a letter to Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) Director David Johnson from County Administrator Bob Middaugh and a

spreadsheet outlining the County's implementation strategies. She explained that tools DCR provided to local governments to help in the planning process, show that James City County has already met Chesapeake Bay TMDL goals that will be in effect by the year 2025. There are several facts that validate this claim: the County implements the Chesapeake Bay Preservation Act county-wide, not just along waterways; the county has a well-funded green space and conservation easements programs; and the county maintains a robust development-rights program. County Staff has met with the Chesapeake Bay Foundation to discuss the County's submittal. Staff used the strategies to develop the Stormwater Division budget request for FY13-14. There was some discussion about the decreasing trend in the Stormwater Division's capital monies.

E. ORDER OF BUSINESS

- **a. 2012 Organization** Aaron Small began the SPAC organization discussion since this was the first meeting of 2012 with a quorum and able to undertake business.
 - i. **Election of Officers** 2012 officers were unanimously elected: Aaron Small (Chair), Charlie Brewster (Vice-Chairman), and Fran Geissler (Secretary).
 - ii. Committee Meeting Agenda for 2012 Fran distributed a handout with different options for meeting dates. Discussion began about meeting frequency, times and locations. Committee members agreed that there would be five meetings this year, with a planning session in November, no county tour of problem areas and project sites, and no January meeting. The tour would be held tentatively in February. Meetings will be the third Tuesday of the month at 4:00 p.m.
