## RESOLUTION

## <u>GRANTING AN EXCEPTION ON JCC RE TAX MAP(12 -2)</u> <u>Parcel #'s (1-14A, 14B, 18, 19, 22, AND 24)</u>

- WHEREAS, HHHunt Communities, Inc, (the "Applicant") has appeared before the Chesapeake Bay Board of James City County (the "Board") on February 13, 2008 to request an extension of the Chesapeake Bay Exception Request granted on February 14, 2007 for use of the Resource Protection Area (the "RPA") on a parcel of property identified as JCC RE Tax Map (12-2) Parcel #'s (1-14A, 14B, 18, 19, 22, and 24) and further identified as 3400 Rochambeau Drive (the "Property") as set forth in the application CBE-06-078 for installation and maintenance of a sanitary sewer connection and a waterline extension for the White Hall development projec.; and
- WHEREAS, the Board has listened to the arguments presented and has carefully considered all evidence entered into the record.
- NOW, THEREFORE, following a public hearing, the Chesapeake Bay Board of James City County by a majority vote of its members FINDS that:
  - 1. The exception request is the minimum necessary to afford relief.
  - 2. Granting the exception will not confer upon the Applicant any special privileges denied by Chapter 23, Chesapeake Bay Preservation, of the James City County Code, to other property owners similarly situated in the vicinity.
  - 3. The exception request will be in harmony with the purpose and intent of Chapter 23 of the James City County Code, and is not of substantial detriment to water quality.
  - 4. The exception request is not based on conditions or circumstances that are self-created or self-imposed, nor does the request arise from conditions or circumstances either permitted or non-conforming that are related to adjacent parcels.
  - 5. Reasonable and appropriate conditions are hereby imposed, as set forth below, which will prevent the exception request from causing a degradation of water quality.
  - 6. In granting this exception, the following conditions are hereby imposed to prevent this exception request from causing degradation of water quality:
    - All recommendations listed within the Water Quality Impact Assessment (WQIA), dated January 22, 2007, are to be incorporated into the site plans for the project, and must receive final approval by the Environmental Division.

- This exception request approval shall become null and void if construction has not begun by <u>February 13, 2009</u>.
- Any changes to the plan of development that would cause any deviation from the items listed in the WQIA either in the form of increased impacts to the RPA or omission of mitigation requirements from the submitted plan of development must be reviewed and approved by the Board.
