




Total General Fund Revenues







- County enters in to franchise negotiations.

Jan.- Feb. 2010

- Current franchise extended to December 31, 2010 to coordinate franchise and fiber agreement expiration dates.
- First draft franchise proposal submitted by Cox.

Mar.-Oct. 2010

- First round of negotiations with Cox .
- Cable Committee reviews franchise draft and submits comments and questions.
- Cox requesting 60-day extension to March 1, 2011.

 - Voice, data, video high speed/reliable

Inet – Future

- Complementary County fiber backbone under contract
- New connections to Police Building, Freedom Park & JCSA Operations Center
- 3. Electronics upgrade at each facility expanded use of existing and future fiber strands
- 4. Connectivity possible with Newport News/York Co./City of Williamsburg

PEG/Inet Capital Fee

Negotiation Update

- Current franchise provides about \$38,000/annually for PEG operations
- 2. Current fee not on customer bill
- 3. FCC allows capital fee/grant only
- 4. Negotiated fee of ## cents (tbd) per subscriber per month on customer bill
