SUBJECT: Waterline Extension - Newport News Waterworks Service Area

Longhouse Village As sociates, L.C., has petitioned Newport News Waterworks to extend water service to Pine Grove Subdivision, a small affordable housing project located in the Grove area of the County. The extension consists of 450 feet of eight- and six-inch waterline, service lines, and a fire hydrant. The development will meet all County regulations before beginning construction.

Longhouse Village Associates, L.C., has agreed to pay the \$2,137 in fees associated with the extension.

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the Chairman to sign the Waterline Extension Agreement on behalf of the JCSA.

SUBJECT: Award of Bid - Newport News Waterworks Interconnect

The James City Service Authority has developed a plan with Newport News Waterworks to interconnect the two water systems in the James Terrace area. The connection will provide supplemental water to the JCSA in case of emergency and periods of high water demand. The interconnection will make available approximately 200,000 gallons of water per day.

The Newport News Waterworks water is from a surface water supply and the JCSA's water is ground water. The two water services have different characteristics and are not necessarily compatible. Therefore, the use of the water from Newport News will be limited to emergency situations.

Plans and specifications for the infrastructure modification required to complete the connection of the two water systems have been advertised, competitively bid, and publicly opened. The following firms submitted bids ranging from \$75,572.41 to \$122,705.67 on the project:

J.L. Warren, Inc., submitted the low bid of \$75,572.41 and has been determined capable of completing the scope of services associated with the project. Adequate funds are in the budget to cover the costs. The project is within the engineer's estimate of \$80,000.

Staff recommends that the Board approve the attached resolution awarding the contract for the Newport News Waterworks Interconnection to J. L. Warren, Inc. for \$75,572.41.

SUBJECT: Award of Contract - Engineering Services - Powhatan Sewer Improvements

The Board of Supervisors recently approved a special use permit (SUP) for the replacement of a sewer pump station located off of Route 5 near the Greensprings Development. The SUP also provided for the construction of a new sewer force main from the pump station to the Alternate Route 5/Monticello Avenue Extended.

The JCSA has solicited proposals from qualified engineering firms to provide engineering services for the project. The engineering services include the design of the new pump station and approximately 3,700 feet of 18- or 20-inch force main. The JCSA force main will tie into an HRSD force main that is being constructed as part of the SUP issued by the Board of Supervisors. The JCSA selected the engineering firm in conjunction with HRSD to ensure continuity in the design and construction of the project.

Six firms were interviewed to provide the required engineering design services. Michael Baker, Jr., Inc., was selected as the top ranked firm. A fee of \$109,800 was negotiated to perform the scope of services. The budget estimate for this service was \$250,000.

Staff recommends that the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the contract for engineering services associated with the LS 1-2 and Powhatan sewer force main to Michael Baker for \$109,800.
