# 3. Contract Award - Phase II Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA)

#### RESOLUTION

### CONTRACT AWARD - PHASE II SUPERVISORY CONTROL AND

#### DATA ACQUISITION SYSTEM (SCADA)

- WHEREAS, the James City Service Authority (JCSA) has completed Phase I of the replacement of its obsolete telemetry alarm system with a Supervisory, Control and Data Acquisition System (SCADA); and
- WHEREAS, Phase II of the SCADA program was a dvertised inviting interested firms to submit a proposal and statement of qualifications to provide the JCSA support to complete retrofit of an additional facilities; and
- WHEREAS, three firms submitted proposal to provide the service and Hartwell Engineering was selected as the firm most capable of supporting the project.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, hereby awards the contact for providing support services of the JCSA's Phase II SCADA program to the Hartwell Engineering for a negotiated fee of \$299,768.95.

SUBJECT: Award of Bid - Sewer Pump Station No. 6-8 Replacement

The plans and specifications for the replacement of Sewer Pump Station 6-8 located on Depot Street in Toano has been advertised for competitive bids. Two firms submitted proposals on the project as follows:

<u>Firm</u>	Bid Amount
Bruce Corporation	\$471,000
T. A. Sheets, Inc.	\$380,000

The lowest responsive bid by T. A. Sheets, Inc., bid is below the engineer's estimated project costs of \$385,000 and within budget allocations. T. A. Sheets Inc., has satisfactorily performed similar work for the James City Service Authority (JCSA) and is currently under contract to complete the improvements to a well facility in Toano.

Staff recommends the Board approve the attached resolution awarding the contract for the replacement of Sewer Pump Station No. 6-8 to T. A. Sheets, Inc., for \$380,000.
