- WHEREAS, James City Service Authority (JCSA) staff has determined that it is prudent to purchase a reserve Potomac Aquifer water pump for the Five Forks Water Treatment Plant from ITT Wet for \$120,515.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, hereby ratifies this purchase as a prudent use of JCSA funds to ensure adequate water supply for JCSA customers.



SUBJECT: Cellular Lease - AT&T - 4600 Warhill Trail

This meeting has been advertised as a public hearing on a lease with AT&T for the location of cellular equipment on the new Warhill water tank. The James City Service Authority currently has a lease with AT&T for locating cellular equipment on the Season's Trace tank which will be razed within the next several months. Board approval will allow the existing lease to be moved to the new Warhill water tank which is approximately 500 feet away from the existing tank.

The terms of the lease have not changed except the new lease is modified to allow 768 square feet, including air space, for the location of the equipment building on the site and the provision of a 20-foot ingress/egress easement along the access road. The lease and easement are located on Tax Parcel Nos. 320100012A and 320100012B. The current lease is in its second five-year term. The lease arrangement with AT&T has been mutually beneficial.

After conducting a public hearing, staff recommends approval of the attached resolution approving the new lease.


# CELLULAR LEASE - AT&T - 4600 WARHILL TRAIL

SUBJECT: Abandonment of Easement – Colonial Heritage

In conjunction with the development of Colonial Heritage in Williamsburg, the developer, Colonial Heritage, LLC, installed a sewer interceptor along the southeast edge of the property. The plat for the sewer line was recorded prior to the installation of the sewer line.

Construction of the sewer line was more difficult than anticipated requiring the installation of the sewer lines in a slightly different alignment than had been plated. As a final step to transfer the sewer line to the James City Service Authority (JCSA), Colonial Heritage has recorded a plat dedicating the easement for the final location and asked that the JCSA abandon the areas included in the original easement.

After receiving public comment, staff recommends that the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the General Manager to sign the appropriate documents releasing the rights to the original easement area.

SUBJECT: Project Development Agreement - Long-Term Water Supply - Newport News Waterworks

Water demand projections for the James City Service Authority (JCSA) reflect a need for 10 million gallons per day in 2040. The JCSA Groundwater Withdrawal Permit issued by the Department of Environmental Quality allows for an average daily withdrawal of 7.9 million gallons of water. The term of the permits ends in 2012 with the JCSA staff intending to renew at current levels upon expiration.

James City County has supported Newport News in its efforts to obtain permits to build the King William Reservoir since 1993 with a plan of purchasing 4 million gallons per day of the reservoir's 20 million gallon per day of safe yield. The project is estimated to cost \$250 million and projected to be completed in the 2020 timeframe. Newport News has determined that it has adequate water to supplement the JCSA groundwater to meet James City County's water needs until the King William Reservoir or another water supply project is available.

Staffs of Newport News and JCSA have developed a Project Development Agreement that provides the terms for the JCSA to purchase water from the City of Newport News. A copy of the agreement is attached. The overarching terms of the agreement are as follows:

- The JCSA can purchase 5 million gallons of water per day on an annual average unless certain drought benchmarks as defined in the Newport News Drought Management Plan are met, at which point the available water will be reduced based on the benchmarks.
- Average daily water for peak demands can be as high as 6.5 million gallons per day.
- The JCSA will pay Newport News \$50 million for the water in two installments \$25 million by December 31, 2008, and the remaining \$25 million (subject to an inflation clause) by June 30, 2019.
- JCSA will be responsible for and will pay 20 percent of the operating and fixed costs of the project annually.
- Newport News will treat the water based on costs of treatment with the first-year costs beginning at \$.70 per 1,000 gallons.
- The provision of the water is not dependent on the construction of the King William Reservoir.

Staffs of both localities have worked diligently to craft an agreement that is fair and meets the needs of both communities. With this in mind, staff recommends the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the Chairman to sign the Project Development Agreement providing the terms for the JCSA to purchase water from the City of Newport News.
