SUBJECT: Right-of-Way Agreement - Dominion Virginia Power - Surry Power Station Emergency Alert

System (EAS)

Dominion Virginia Power (Dominion) has requested a right-of-way and utility easement (Easement) across a portion of James City Service Authority property in order to provide electrical service to two new Surry Power Station Emergency Alert System (EAS) sirens.

The first requested Easements is 15 feet in width and is located at 4100 Longview Landing, further identified as Parcel No. 3630200001E on the James City County Real Estate Tax Map. The second site is located on Parcel No. at 2351 West Island road Parcel No. 4410200001D and includes a 10 foot easement. The easements are being conveyed for no consideration. Transfer of the easements does not impact JCSA's use of the property. If necessary, the location of the easement can be adjusted upon request by the JCSA.

Staff recommends approval of the attached resolution authorizing the General Manager to execute the Easement documents with Dominion Power.

#### SURRY POWER STATION EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM (EAS)

- WHEREAS, James City Service Authority owns 0.372 acre located at 4100 Longview Landing and designated as Parcel No. 3630200001E and 0.237 acre located at 2351 West Island Road and designated as Parcel No.4410200001D on the James City County Real Estate Tax Map; and
- WHEREAS, Dominion Virginia Power (Dominion) requires right-of-way and utility easements of 15 feet in width across a portion of the parcel at 4100 Longview Landing and 10-feet in width across a portion of the parcel at 2351 West Island Road in order to improve reliability for the Surry Power Station Emergency Alert System (EAS) by adding two alert sirens; and
- WHEREAS, conveyance of the easements will have minimal impact on the JCSA since the easements are being conveyed for no consideration, the easements will not impact the JCSA's use of the properties, and the location of the easement can be adjusted upon request by the JCSA; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Directors, following a public hearing, is of the opinion that it is in the public interest to convey right-of-way and utility easements to Dominion.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the James City Service Authority, James City County, Virginia, hereby authorizes the General Manager to execute the right-of-way agreements and other such documents necessary to convey the utility easements to Dominion for the Surry Power Station Emergency Alert System (EAS).



<b>Summary:</b> The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and the developer of the Marywood subdivision have requested that the James City Service Authority (JCSA) extinguish a water and sewer easement that is located within a right-of-way that has been created/dedicated for the extension of Braddock and Spring Road. The roads have been extended to serve the Marywood Development. The easement existed before the right-of-way was created. The JCSA will maintain access to the water and sewer lines located within the easement via the new VDOT right-of-way.

SUBJECT: Extinguishment of JCSA Utility Easement in Braddock Road and Spring Road Right-of-Way

Centex Homes requested acceptance of Braddock Road and Spring Road, which were extended to serve the Marywood development, into the Virginia Department of Highways road system. The James City Service Authority (JCSA) has pre-existing utility easements that are located within the newly created right-of-way, thereby requiring those portions of the existing JCSA utility easements located within the right-of-way be extinguished.

This meeting has been advertised as a public hearing on extinguishing portions of the JCSA Urban Easement that were pre-existing before the establishment of the right-of-way of Braddock and Spring Road. The extinguishment of the easement will not impact the JCSA's ability to maintain the water and sewer lines located with the exiting easement. It is very common practice for the JCSA to have and maintain utility lines within the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) right-of-ways.

After receiving public comment and closing the public hearing, JCSA staff recommends that the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the General Manager to sign the necessary documents to extinguish the JCSA utility easement. This approval will clear one of the final hurdles for acceptance into the VDOT system of Braddock Road and Spring Road as shown on the attached plat dated March 5, 2007.
