## AN ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Board of Supervisors of the County of James City.

1- That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, engaged in the business of a merchant, to buy, sell, give away, exchange, or in any wise deal in or dispose of any rifle, pistol or revolver catridges, or any gun shells loaded with shot of a size larger than that known to the trade as "Number four" without a written permit from the Clark of the Board authorizing him so to do and further complying with all of the provisions in this ordinance contained, and it shall be unlawfu for any person, firm or corporation, not engaged in the mercantile business, to buy, sell give away, exchange, or in any wise deal in or dispose of any rifle, pistol, or revolver catridges, or any gun shells loaded with shot larger than number four, with out first complying with all of the provisions in this contained.

2- Any person, firm or corporation, engaged in the mercantile business in this county and desibing to buy, sell, give away, exchange, or otherwise deal in or dispose of any of the ammunition described in the preceding paragraph, shall first apply to and receive from the Clerk a written permit suthorizing him to so deal in the said ammunition.

3- Any person, firm or corporation, other than those engaged in the merchatile business, desiring to in any manner secure any ammunition described in the classes of ammunition mentioned in paragraph one of this ordinance, shall first secure

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from the Clerk a written permit authorizing him to secure the same.

4- It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, to buy, sell, give away, exchange, or otherwise deal in dispose of any of the ammunition described in paragraph one of this ordinance, excepting that any merchant, holding the permit mentioned in paragraph two of this ordinance, may buy such ammunition for sale to any person holding the permit mentioned on paragraph three of this ordinance and, excepting further,

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that such sale shall only be made to the person to whom the permit is issued, and in the quantity and kind mentioned in such permit, and such permit shall be then and there surrendered to the person making the sale, who will enderse on the back of same the amount and kind of ammunition sold, to whom delivered, the date of sale, and by whom sold, and retain the said permit in a convenient place for the inspection of the Sheriff, or any police officer, any time during business hours.

5- The Clerk may in his discretion issue or refuse to issue any permit provided for in this ordinance, and for good cause shown may revoke the same, but for every permit issued hereunder, there shall be paid by the applicant the sum of twenty cents, which shall be deposited to the credit of said ounty

6- Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined a sum not less than \$5 00 nor more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisioned in the ^County Jail for a term not longer than sixty days or both, at the discretion of the officer trying the case.

7- An emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall become operative from the day of its passage.


