Mr. Kenneth Chorley on behalf of the Williamsburg Holding Corporation and Colonial Williamsburg, Inc., called to the attention of the joint meeting the previous action taken by the committee under the contract for conveyance of the old courthouse designating the public use for the old courthouse as that of a PUBLIC LIBRARY and requested the joint session to reconsider its action in this connection and in support of this request stated that since the old courthouse building has been rebuilt, they were of opinion that a library was not the best public use to which it could be put, and that in order to meet the needs for Library facilities in Williamsburg they were willing and did offer the building at the southwest intersection of England and Francis Street under a lease to the Library at \$1.00 per year for a five (5) year period from this date with an option to the LESSEE to renew at the end of the term for a further period of three (3) years. That they would equip the building as a Library by the installation of suitable fixtures, that at their expense they would install a heating system and connect the same with the courthouse heating plant, also connect the water line, this latter connection of the water, heat and electric light line to be with the authroity and approval of this joint body, and that this offer is effective with the approval of the library Association of this joint body and on the further condition that the old courthouse be released for some other PUBLIC use othen than that of a LIBRARY.

Miss Ann Chapman, Chairman of the Library Committee, Mrs Southgate, President of the Civic League, Mrs Krebs, Chairman of Civics Committee and Jeannet te
Kelly, stated to the joint session after hearing the offer made by Mr. Chorley that the
approval was satisfactory to them.

Whereupon it was moved by Mr. P. H. Richardson that the joint session reconsider its action heretofore taken in equiping the old courthouse for a public library and that it remain for some other public use and further that the joint bodies accept the offer of Mr. Chorley, and that they agree for the period of the lease to the Library or so much of said period as the library shall occupy said building that it it may have a hook up for light, water and heat service with the courthouse building and that the Williamsburg Holding Corporation be, and is hereby authorized to enter upon and do all necessary work in connection with the laying and connecting of mater, heat and light lines in accordance with plans contemplated by Mr. Chorleys offer, and further that the lease be negotiated between the owners and the LESSEE carrying out the provisions of this resolution be subject to the counsel of the respective bodies.

The vote being taken on the foregoing resolution resulted in the unanimous adoption of same.

It was brought to our attention that during the last two weeks wholesale arrest have been made in this County of persons who for the first time have been
charged with failing to have in their possession a drivers permit as required by law, although in most of these cases permits had been obtained by the persons in question, but
in spite of this fact a fine was imposed in each instance, in as much as we are of the
opinion that the real purpose of the law requiring these permits is to prohibit irresponsible persons from operating automobiles on public highways, and

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of James City County pay to Calvin C. Motion duly made and carried that \$50.00 be transferred from the General fund to the expense account of the Treasurer's office.

ORDINANCE

An ordinance to prevent the pollution of water, to protect health and to regulaye te disposal of human waste and excrements in the County of James City, Virginia, prescribing certain types and location of sanitary closets or privies, and size, drainage field, and location of septic tanks, and for controlling the construction of sewer systems and disposal plants, and providing a punishment for failure to comply with said ordinance.

Be it ordained by the Board of Supervisors of James City County, Virginia, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any house or type of construction used as a human habitation, any warehouse, any public building or other place where human beings congregate or are employed in the County of James City, to rent, occupy or lease the same for occupancy by any person, firm, or corporation to occupy

the same, unless and until the said house, building, or structure where a human is living or or is to live has been supplied or equipped with a sanitary closet or privy for the catchment or receiving of human discharges, as will comply with the requirements hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. A sanitary privy is one built, re-built or constructed in such a manner that it will meet the following requirements:

- (a) No privy shall be built, re-constructed, or allowed to be used for the disposal of human excrement which could endanger a source of human water supply.
- (b) The excreta disposed therein shall not be allowed to fall upon the surface of the ground, but in some vault or receptacle provided.
- (c) The contents of such vault or receptacle shall not be accessible to flies, fowl, or animals at any time.
- (d) The seat box of said privy shall be constructed of metal, concrete, or should seasoned tongue and grooved lumber, all joints being made tight.
 - (e) The seat box shall be provided with a top or cover closely fitting.
- (f) Each seat shall be provided with a self-closing, hinged lid, fastened with two hinges, and so arranged as to render said seat box fly proof.
- (g) Proper ventilation shall be provided by a suitably placed ventilator or flu, covered with 16 mesh copper wire screen.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation shall, before starting any new subdivision, development, or any subdivision in the process of developing, shall furnish in triplicate, plans and specifications, of the sewer system or type of sewerage disposal to be used in the locality of human habitation. These plans and specifications must be approved by a representative of the "James City County Board of Health, and the County Health Officer or the Sanitation Officer thereof, each shall be deemed to be the representative of said Board for all purposes of this ordinance."

Section 4. No persons, firm or corporation shall construct, maintain, or permit on any premises owned my him, and arrangement for the disposal of human excrements which may endanger the source of drinking water or fail to comply with the foregoing requirements.

Section 5. No person, firm, or corporation shall allow to be deposited any human excrement upon the surface of the ground or any other place where it may endanger a source of drinking water or be accessible to flies, fowl or animals.

Section 6. Any pne of the following types of sanitary privies may be installed; (a" The standard pit type: (b) The concrete vault, or (c) The concrete slab type.

A satisfactory flush type of water closet may be used if connected with an approved sewer system or an approved septic tank system, provided this meets the approval of a representative of the County Board of Health.

Section 7. All sanitary privies shall be kept in a clean condition at all times, and so used that all excreta disposed therein will fall into the vault or receptable provided for that purpose. No vault or receptacle shall be permitted to become filled or overflowing.

Section 8. Every house used as a human habitation, every warehouse, every public building or other public building where human beings congregate or are employed, in the County of James City, if equipped with a satisfactory flush water closet, shall

not be allowed to discharge on the ground or into small streams, ditches or creeks, but shall be provided by the owner with an approved septic tank or connected to an approved sewer system. In the future, cess pools will not be permitted in the County of James City.

Section 9. It shall be unlawful for any one to install a septic tank in James City County without first obtaining a permit from a representative of the County Board of Health. No such permit shall be issued unless an inexpensive, detailed sketch in duplicate on homes to be prescribed by said Board, showing the exact location in feet and inches of such septic tank, and its relation to the adjacent lot boundaries, local water supply, and existing or projected buildings. A representative of the said Board shall decide the capacity of the septic tank, and the number of feet of sub-soil pipe to be used. The capacity shall be as follows:

In no case shall a fewer number of feet of subsoil drainage pipe be used than that specified by a representative of the said Board. This pipe shall be laid in conformity with the specifications of the Virginia State Board of Health.

Section 10. Septic tanks shall be installed under the supervison of a representative of the County Board of Health. The septic tanks shall be inspected and approved by a representative of the County Board of Health before they are permitted to be covered.

Section 11. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to neglect, fail, or refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 12. Any person, firm or corporation who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined the sum not exceeding fifty dollars, and each week of failure or refusal to comply with the provisions shall be deemed a separate offense and he shall be fined an additional sum of not exceeding fifty dollars for each week of failure or refusal to comply with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 13. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 14. This ordinance shall become effective upon its approval by the County Board of Health and its passage by the Board of Supervisors.

The Board of Supervisors having had brought ot its attention the situation with reference to the causeway over Wares Mill Pond, which causeway is partly in James City City County and partly in York County, and the causeway over Newman's Pond, which is also partly in Bruton District of York County, and over each of which causeways there is a connecting link of secondary highway, and it further appearing that Ware's Mill Pond is a short distance up stream from Newman's Mill Pond, and that it is not possible to protect Newman's Mill Pond causeway from excessive high water unless Ware's Mill Pond causeway is sufficiently strengthened to prevent the upper dam from breaking in a storm and thereby throwing the entire body of water against the lower causeway.

And it further appearing that during the repeated high water of the last few years, that the break of the upper dam and consequent break of the lower dam has occurred at least three times without any sufficient action being taken to prevent further like occurrences.

Now, therefore, this Board recommends to the State Highway Commission and ot its engineers, that an inspection be made of conditions above recited, and that the Department do what is necessary to present a re-occurrence of the breaking of the said causeway, and,

Be it further resolved that in the opinion of this Board the best results can be obtained by sufficiently elevating and strengthing the causeway over Ware's Mill Pond, so as to protect the Newman's Mill dam from a possible break of the upper dame

Both of these causeways form connecting links in highways of considerable convenience and travel to the general public, and the repeated washouts of same are especially inconvenient and troublesome.

Be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be certified by the Clerk of this Board to the State Highway Commissioner and to the Resident Engoneer.

This action of the Board is conditioned upon the Board of Supervisors of York County concurring in this resolution.

Any person convicted of a second or other subsequent offense under this act shall be punishable by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one Thousand Dollars and by imprisonment for not less than one month nor more than one year and no court shall suspend the sentence in any such case.

The judgment of conviction, shall of itself operate to deprive the person convicted of the right to drive or operate any such vehicle, conveyance, engine or train, in the State of Virginia for a period of one year from the date of such judgment and if for a second or other subsequent offense for a period of three years from the date of the judgment of conviction thereof.

If any person has heretofore been convicted of violating any similar ordinance or State Law and thereafter is convicted of violating the provision of the first paragraph of this ordinance, such conviction shall for the purpose of this ordinance be a subsequent offense and shall be punished accordingly.

BE IT RESOLVED that the CHAIRMAN of this Board be and he is hereby authorized and empowered and directed to deed with the City of Williamsburg and which deed shall first be approved by the Attorney for the Commonwealth, conveying unto Colonial Williamsburg Inc., in the name and on behalf of the County of James City, the right, title and interest of said County in and to the said lot of land, which deed shall embrace and provision restrict the use of the said lot to a public parking space and which deed shall be in substantial accord with the tentative deed this day presented to the Board and made a part of the minutes of this meeting, and

It is further ordered that the Clerk is authorized and directed to affix the seal of the County of James City to the said deed and to attest same.

THIS DEED made this day of June, 1938, between the CITY OF WILLIAMS-BURG, a body politic and corporate under the laws of the State of Virginia, and the COUNTY OF JAMES CITY, a body corporate under the laws of the State of Virginia, as parties of the first part, hereinafter designated as the Grantors, COLONILA WILLIAMSBURG, INCOR-PORATED, a corporation created by and existing under the laws of the State of Virginia, party of the second part, hereinafter designated as the Grantee, and WILLIAMSBURG REST-ORATION, INCORPORATED, a corporation created by and existing under the laws of the State of Virginia, party of the third part;

WHEREAS, by agreement dated June 14, 1928, by and between the City of Williamsburg, Board of Supervisors of James City County, Wm. A. R. Goodwin, Colonial Williamsburg, Incorporated, and Williamsburg Holding Corporation (now known by authority of the Corporation Commission of the State of Virginia as Williamsburg Restoration, Incorporated) recorded June 19, 1928, in Williamsburg Deed Book 12, pages 558-569, and by supplemental agreement dated June 2, 1930, by and between the same parties, recorded January 19, 1932, in Williamsburg Deed Book 15, pages 49-53, Wm. A. R. Goodwin, Colonial Williamsburg, Incorporated, and Williamsburg Holding Corporation did covenant to convey, on terms and condititions therein set forth, to the City of Williamsburg and County of James City a parcel of land with the buildings and improvements thereon, which parcel of land is described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the West line of England Street fifty-two feet (52') South of the South property line of Francis Street along the line of the present fence, running thence West on a line parallel to the South property line of Francis Street a distance of one hundred and seventeen feet, nine inches (117' 9"); running thence North fifty-two (52') to the South property line of Francis Street; running thence West

along the South property line of Francis Street a distance of twelve feet (12'); running thence South in a line parallel to the West line of England Street a distance of fifty-two feet (52'); running thence West on a line parallel to the said South property line of Francis Street a distance of one hundred and eight feet, three inches (108' 3"); running thence South along a line parallel to the West line of England Street four hundred and thirty-four feet (434') to the North line of Ireland Street; running thence East along the North line of Ireland Street two hundred and thirty-eight feet (238') to the West line of England Street; running thence North along the West line of England Street four hundred and thirty-four feet (434') to the point of beginning. The said property being bounded on the East by England Street; on the South by Ireland Street; on the West by property of Williamsburg Holding Corporation; and on the North by property of Williamsburg Holding Corporation and Francis Street.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the said agreement and said supplemental agreement above described, Williamsburg Holding Corporation, by deed dated December 21, 1931, and recorded January 19, 1932, in Williamsburg Deed Book 15, pages 67-73, did convey and the City of Williamsburg and James City County did take conveyance of that property described above subject to the following covenant and agreement: "The City of Williamsburg and James City County shall maintain parking space on the southerly end of the parcel of land on which the new Court House and Jail are to be erected, which parking space shall be maintained in good and safe condition and as far as possible in harmony with the landscaping of the ground surrounding the new Court House and Jail":

WHEREAS, Colonial Williamsburg, Incorporated, desires to acquire and maintain the said parking area on the southerly end of the parcel of land above described; and

WHEREAS, Williamsburg Restoration, Incorporated, (the name of which was formerly Williamsburg Holding Corporation) is willing to agree that a conveyence of said southerly end of said parcel of land to Colonial Williamsburg, Incorporated, shall not be deemed a violation of the terms, conditions, restrictions, covenants and agreements in the deed above described, dated December 21, 1930; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of Virginia by an act entitled "An act authorizing the Council of the City of Williamsburg and the Board of Supervisors of the County of James City to convey or to lease to Colonial Williamsburg, Incorporated, its successors and assigns certain property owned by the said City and County", being Chapter 258 of Acts of General Assembly for 1938, enacted, "That the Council of the City of Williamsburg and the Board of Supervisors of the County of James City, be, and they are, hereby authorized and empowered to transfer, assign and convey or lease to Colonial Williamsburg, Incorporated, its successors and assigns forever, the southerly end of said parcel of land. For use as a public parking space which shall be maintained in good and safe condition as far as possible in harmony with the landscaping of the grounds surrounding the said Court House and Jail except that such limitation on the use of the property shall not preclude the construction and maintenance by the Grantee, its successors and assigns, of a road running westerly from South England Street along the north side of the property so transferred, assigned and conveyed, or leased."; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Williamsburg and the Board of Supervisors of James City County have by separate resolutions duly authorized their proper officials to make such conveyance.

NOW THIS DEED WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the above premises, and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration paid by the Grantee to the Grantors at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the Grantors herein grant, bargain, sell, and convey to the Grantee herein with covenants of Special Warranty the following property, to-wit:

All that certain lot or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the City of Williamsburg, Virginia, together with the buildings and improvements thereon, and bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point on the west line of England Street 267.65 feet from the ancient street line on the south side of Francis Street, said point being the outer southeast corner of the existing brick wall, thence in a southerly direction along the west line of England Street 233.40 feet to the north line of Ireland Street, thence in a westerly direction 238.00 feet along the north line of Ireland Street, thence N. 40 30' 36" W. 233.40 feet to a point 267.65 feet south of the ancient street line on the south side of Francis Street, said point being the outer southwest corner of existing brick wall, thence in an easterly direction 238.00 feet along the outer edge of the existing brick wall to the point of beginning, all of which is more particularly shown on a plat entitled a copy of which is attached and hereby made an integral part of this deed.

The property herein conveyed being the southerly portion of that property conveyed by Williamsburg Holding Corporation to the City of Williamsburg and James City County by deed dated December 21, 1931, and recorded January 19, 1932 in Williamsburg Deed Book 15, pages 67-73.

IT IS COVENANTED AND AGREED:

That the Grantee will maintain the property herein conveyed for use as a public parking space in good and safe conditions and as far as possible in harmony with the landscaping of the gounds surrounding the Court House and Jail; except that said limitation on the use of the property shall not preclude the construction and maintenance by the Grantee, its successors or assigns of a road running westerly from South England Street along the north side of the property herein conveyed.

IT IS FURTHER COVENANTED AND AGREED:

That the Grantors shall have, for so long a time as that property

known as the Court House and Jail property shall be used for municipal, governmental and/or roadway as may be maintained on the premises herein conveyed for ingress to and egress from said Court House and Jail property.

The Grantee unites in the execution of the deed for the purpose of evidencing their acceptance thereof and their agreement to the covenants and agreements herein contained.

THE party of the third part, Williamsburg Restoration, Incorporated, (formerly known as Williamsburg Holding Corporation) joins in this deed for the purpose of releasing the City of Williamsburg and County of James City from the terms, conditions, restrictions, covenants, and agreements of the said deed dated December 21, 1930, recorded January 19, 1931, in Williamsburg Deed Book 15, pages 67-73, to such extent, and no more, as is herein specified.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF: The City of Williamsburg has caused the name of said City to be hereunto subscribed by Channing M. Hall, its duly authorized and empowered Mayor, as the act and deed of said City and has caused its seal to be hereunto affixed and attested by Virginia Blanchard, its Clerk, and James City County has caused its name to be hereunto subscribed by P. H. Richardson, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of said County, and its seal to be affixed and attested by Virginia Blanchard, its Clerk; and Colonial Williamsburg, Incorporated, has caused its name to be hereunto subscribed by Kenneth Chorley, its President, thereunto duly authorized and its corporate seal to be affixed and attested by John V. Duncan, its Secretary, thereunto duly authorized, and Williamsburg Restoration, Incorporated, has caused its name to be hereunto subscribed by V. M. Geddy, its Vice-president, thereunto duly authorized and its seal to be affixed and attested by Elizabeth S. Stubbs, its Assistant Secretary, thereunto duly authorized.

Mr. R. Nelson Smith, Chairman of the Legal Defense Committee reported

The minutes of the preceding meetings were read and approved.

Mr. W. C. Martin presented to the Board a sketch of a sign to be erected at the gates entering the courthouse yard, designating said building as the Courthouse, which sign was approved by the Board and turned over to Mr. Lloyd Williams to present to the City Council for approval.

Motion of Mr. Martin duly made and seconded and adopted that the Secondary System Budget of the Department of Highways for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1941 as submitted by the Reisdent Engineer was unanimously adopted.

Motion duly made and unanimously carried, that we carry \$26,600.00 in the 1941-2 budget for Schools.

Motion carried that we appropriate \$275.00 as an additional to the Health Unit contingent upon the Citys' appropriation.

Motion duly made and carried that the Jail Rules be adopted as follows:

Proposed set of Rules and Regulations for the Government of the Jail of the City of Williamsburg and County of James City.

RULE 1. All prisoners, except women, being held pending charges of felonies, and all prisoners, except women, who have been tried and convicted and sentenced to imprisonment for either felony or misdemeanor shall be kept inside of the cell block at all times unless accompained by the jailor. Except, further, the jailor shall have discretion as to confining white and colored prisoners in the same cage or cell and at all times the jailor shall keep the most dangerous and those charged with the most serious offenses confined in individual, locked cells within the cell blocks.

RULE la. All prisoners, except women, who have been convicted of felonies shall be locked in cells within the cell block unless accompanied by the jailor.

RULE 2. All doors and cages, to and in said jail shall be securely locked at all times except when opened by the jailor or any other duly authorized officer.

RULE 3. No package, food, bundle, clothing, letter or other substance, whether of like kind or not small be delivered to any prisoner in said jail until it is first examined by the keeper of said jail.

RULE 4. All prisoners shall be carefully searched when put into said jail and all money and other articles mentioned in rule five shall be taken from said prisoner. The jailor shall keep a list of all articles and the names of the prisoners from whom taken.

RULE 5. The City Sergeant shall be required to help all prisoners securely locked within the cell blocks at all times except as otherwise provided herein. He may in his discretion allow one trusty the freedom of the second floor corridor. This allowance is made in order that the trusty may communciate with persons outside the jail in the event of an emergency.

RULE 6. The City Sergeant shall have complete charge and control of the jail and jail property; he or some person employed and or appointed by him for that purpose shall be at all times on duty within the said jail between the hours of 8 P. M. and 6:30 A. M.

RULE 7. No prisoner shall be allowed at any time, any knife, razor, spoon, fork, broom, piece of wood or metal or any other substance whether of like kind or note, which may be used in any manner in defacing said jail or used in an attempt to escape from said jail; except, that prisoners may be allowed to have a knife, fork and spoon while eating but such knife, fork and spoon shall be taken from the prisoner as soon as he or she has finished eating, except further that male prisoners may be allowed to have a razor for the purpose of shaving which shall be taken from said prisoner as soon as he shall have finished shaving and if a safety razor is used the prisoner shall not be allowed to have more than one blade at a time.

RULE 8. All brooms, shovels, fire pokers and other instruments whether of wood or of metal, all fire wood, oil cans and other substance shall be at all times kept out of the reach of prisoners.

RULE 9. All stills or parts of stills or containers or other applicances capable of being used in the manufacture of ardent spirits and all ardent spirits and other articles that may be necessary to be kept in said jail to be used as evidence in prosecution for violations of the law shall at all times be kept locked securely and away from the prisoners.

RULE 10. None but women, and men charged with misdemeanors shall be put or kept in the rooms on the second floor of said jail, if there is available room in the cage within the cell block; and, at all times the most dangerous prisoners and those charged with the most serious offenses shall be kept in the cells within the cell blocks, subject to Rules 1 and 1a.

RULE 11. No prisoner shall deface or destroy or other wise damage said jail or beds or bed clothing or any fixture in said jail or any copy of these regulations posted in said jail. Any prisoner shall be responsible for any damage done.

RULE 12. If any prisoner violates any one or more of these rules and regulations he or she shall be considered to be guilty of misconduct and no time shall be deducted from his or her sentence of confinement in said jail.

INFORMATION

SECTION 2860 of the Code of Virginia provides that a prisoner in jail, if he faithfully observes the rules and regulations of the jail while confined therein, shall, with the consent of the Judge, have deducted from his or her period of confinement ten days from each month.

SECTION 2858 of the Code of Virginia provides that it shall be unlawful for any person other than the officer of the law in charge of the premises,

the counsel of the prisoner, or such other person as may be determined by the court in whose custody said prisoner may be, to hold any communication, by work, sign or writing with said prisoner or prisoners confined in any jail in the Commonwealth of Virginia except in the presence of the Sheriff or his deputies or the jailor regularly in charge of said prisoner or prisoners, and any person violating or attempting to violate this Section, or any sheriff, deputy, or other person in charge of said prisoner or prisoners knowingly allowing any violation of same shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction be fined not less than Five Dollars nor more than \$50.00.

AN ORDINANCE:

An ordinance providing for cooperation in the National Defense; appointing a Coordinator of bolunteer emergency service: authorizing the Coordinator to proclaim rules and regulations pertaining to plans for protection from Air Raids, and emergency plans for the protection of public safety and the general welfare of the inhabitants of James City County, and trial tests of such plans.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of James City as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of carrying into effect and enforcing the provisions of this ordinance there is hereby created the office of Coordination of Volunteer Emergency Service who shall be a citizen of James City County and shall be

a citizen of James City County and shall be elected by this Board for such term of office as it may prescribe.

SECTION 2. The Coordination is hereby authorized and directed, whenever a state of war exists between the United States and any foreign country or nation, to proclaim and publish rules and regulations, which shall have full force and effect of law, for the conduct and cooperation of persons, firms, corporations and agencies. Such rules and regulations may include black out, light up, or lighting distribution rearrangement, including the intensity and distribution of all street, residential, commercial and other lighting. Such rules and regulations may further include those affecting fire, police, health, highways and the general protection of the public, and may require drills and practice exercises. The Coordinator may require any inhabitant or any organization of the County to aid in enforcing such rules and regulations. The Coordinator may also rerequest assistance from organizations such as the Reginal Defense Council, the Red Cross, the Virginia Protective Force and other local, State and National Organizations. The said Coordinator shall direct the preparation and execution of disaster plans and volunteer emergency service in cooperation with the Reginal and a State Defense Council.

SECTION 3. Special lighting of an emergency nature, such as black out, light up, lighting distribution rearrangement or change in general lighting intensity shall be placed in effect upon receipt of an order that such action is necessary or desireable from the Governor or the district warning center to the said Coordination.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawfuly to refuse or neglect to obey any such rules and regulations as proclaimed by the Coordinat/or or refuse or neglect to obey any order of the Coordinator in connection therewith, or any call made upon any person, firm, corporation and agency for aid in enforcing the same.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall constitute an exercise by the County of its governmental functions for the protection of the public safety, health and general welfare of the inhabitants and neither the county nor any such person, firm, corporation or agency responding to the regulations lawfully proclaimed and published by the coordinator, or called upon to assist in enforcing the same, shall be liable in a suit for damage in connection therewith.

SECTION 6. Violation of or failure to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance or of the rules and regulations proclaimed by the Coordination connection therewith shall be deemed a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding exceeding Fifty Dellars (\$50.) and by confinement in jail for thirty days, either or both, in the discretion of the court trying the same. But before such rules and regulations of the Coordinator shall have the force and effect of law they shall be submitted and be approved by a recorded vote of this Board.

- W. C. Martin, Esq.

The minutes of the preceding meetings were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. J. B. Vaiden, unanimously adopted, the Treasurer was authorized to transfer the sum of \$3330.00 from the General Fund to the Contingency Fund for which to buy U. S. Defense Bonds Serial "G" for the Sinking Funds.

Motion of Mr. W. C. Martin, duly made and unanimously adopted that the Board go on record as favoring an increase in the salary of L. P. Trice, Sheriff, over and above the amount allowed by the compensation board.

Motion duly made and carried that the following ordinance be unanimously adopted.

An Ordinance regulating camp sites and grounds for automobiles and trailers, and to provide for the enforcement and penalties for violation thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JAMES CITY COUNTY as follows:

Section 1. For the purpose of this ordinance certain words and phrases are defined as follows, and certain provisions shall be construed as herein set forth, unless it shall be apparent from their context that they have a different meaning.

Words used in the singular include the plural, and the plural the singular. Words used in the present tense include the future.

A "Camp automobile and/or Trailer" is any unit used for living or sleeping purposes and which may be or is intended for transport from one place to another

whether by motive power or other means.

"Camp sites" or "camp grounds" are defined to be any place, lot or tract of land upon which is located or is held out for the location of any camp automobile and/or trailer.

"Health Department" is the Health Officer of James City County.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the health department to enforce all of the provisions of this ordinance and for the purpose of securing enforcement thereof, the health officer, or any of his duly authorized representatives, shall have the right and are hereby empowered to enter upon the premises of any camp site or ground now operating, or which may hereafter be operated within the County of James City to inspect the same and all accommodations connected therewith.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate or maintain, or to offer for public use, within the confines of the County of James City, as hereinafter set forth, any camp site or ground without first applying for and receiving from the health department a permit so to do, in the manner hereinafter provided, or without complying with the regulations hereinafter set forth, or any rules and regulations which may be formulated by the Health Department from time to time and the laws of the State of Virginia.

Section 4. Each application for such permit shall be in writing upon a form provided by the Health Department for that purpose. It shall state the name and address of the applicant and a description of the property, whereon or wherein, it is proposed to conduct a camp site or ground. It also shall contain such other information as the Health Department may require and it shall be filed by the applicant. It shall be filed with the Health Department not less than five days, nor more than 30 days before said camp site or ground is made ready for use.

Section 5. Upon the filing of such application, it shall be the duty of the Health Department or any of its duly authorized representatives to investigate the premises and determine whether said proposed camp site or ground selected therefor conforms with the regulations and requirements of this ordinance, the rules and regulations of the Health Department and the laws of the State of Virginia, and no permit shall be issued unless such camp ground or the site selected therefor complies with such requirements and meets the approval of the Health Department, and said department may at the discretion approve or reject any proposed camp ground site.

Section 6. Any permit granted hereunder shall be subject to revocation or suspension by the Health Department in the following manner to wit: A notice shall be served on the person holding said permit specifying wherein he has failed to comply with the ordinance, and requiring him to appear before the Health Department, at a day and hour therein specified, not less than five days after the personal service of said notice on such permit holder, requiring him to show cause at said time and place why said permit should not be revoked or suspended. At the time and place mentioned in said notice, the person holding said permit shall have the right to appear in person, or by counsel, and to introduce such evidence as he may desire, and the Health Department shall confront said permit holder with any charges that said Health Department may have against him, and after said hearing, the health department may, at its discretion, revoke or suspend

the permit.

Section 7. Such permit shall be transferable upon the written application of the holder of the permit to the Health Department and with its consent endorsed thereon. A permit may be granted at any time during the year, and unless previously revoked shall expire on the first day of the year following the date of its issue.

Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to establish, maintain, conduct or carry on any camp site or ground unless there shall be at all times posted in a conspicuous place at said camp site or ground the permit obtained from the Health Department in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 9. The provisions of this ordinance shall be applicable to this ordinance shall be applicable to every camp site or ground within the County of James City and it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation maintaining, operating, conducting, or carrying on any such camp site or ground or for any person living or sleeping in any camp automobile and/or trailer located on a camp site or ground, or any other person, to violate or contribute in any way to the violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 10. Every person owning or operating a camp site or ground shall maintain on such a camp site or ground any toilets, baths, or other permanent equipment in connection therewith, in a clean and sanitary condition and shall maintain said equipment in a state of good repair.

Section 11. The Health Department is hereby empowered to formulate from time to time and to enforce any rules and regulations that said department may deem advisable governing the operation of camp sites or grounds or camp automobiles and/or trailers bearing on any matters of sanitation or housing.

Section 12. No camp site or ground hereafter established shall be located within the following areas of the County of James City.

Section 13. Every camp site or ground hereafter established shall be laid off with, and all existing camp sites or grounds shall provide, available unoccupied space of not less than twenty feet by forty feet for each camp automobile and/or trailer, and such available unoccupied space shall not be construed to mean the space directly under any portion of any camp automobile and/or trailer. Camp automobile and/or trailer shall be arranged in orderly rows abutting or facing on a driveway or clear unoccupied space of not less than 25 feet in width, which space shall have unobstructed access to a public street or alley.

Section 14. Every camp site or ground hereafter established shall be located on a well drained area and the premises of every camp site or ground or any existing camp site or ground shall be properly granded so as to prevent the accumulation of storm and casual waters.

Section 15. An adequate supply of pure water for drinking and domestic purposes shall be supplied to meet the requirements of said camp site or ground. Said water supply shall be obtained from faucets only, conveniently located in said camp site or ground, and no dipping vessels or common cups shall be permitted. The water supply shall be properly located, constructed and operated, and shall be easily accessible and of a safe sanitary quality, and received only from sources, wells, springs or central water supplies approved by the Health Department.

Section 16. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation owning or operating a camp automobile and/or trailer located in a camp site or ground to remove or cause to have removed the wheels or any similar transporting devises from said camp automobiles and/or trailer or to otherwise permanently fix it to the ground in a manner that would prevent ready removal of said camp automobile and/or trailer without first obtaining a permit to do so, from the Health Department. Any alteration to any camp automobile and/or trailer, as above set forth, shall be converting it into a dwelling and it shall thereupon be subject to the requirements of the sewerage disposal law of the County of James City.

Section 17. Dogs at no time shall be permitted to run at large in any camp site or ground unless muzzled.

Section 18. There shall be provided in every existing camp site or ground and every camp or ground which may hereafter be established one water closet for each sex; one of such water closets shall be distinctly marked "For Women" and one such water closets shall be distinctly marked "For Men" and there shall be provided an additional water closet for each sex for every ten or fractional part thereof in excess of ten males or females living in said camp site or ground; provided, however, that the Health Department may exempt any camp site or ground existing at the time of the passage of this ordinance from fully complying with the provisions of this section when, in its discretion, such deviation will not be determental to the health of persons occupying said camp site or ground or to the proper sanitation of the premises. All flush toilets must be connected to an approved sewer system, or provided with properly constructed septic tank system. Pit privies must be of a standard approved by the Health Department.

Section 19. There shall be provided in every camp site or ground here-tofore or hereafter established, such number of tight receptacles with close fitting covers for garbage, refuse, ashes and rubbish as may be deemed necessary by the Health Department and such garbage receptacles shall at all times be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, the disposal of the said garbage refuse, ashes and rubbish shall be the duty of the camp site owner, or his agent and shall be done in a manner approved by the Health Department.

Section 20. There shall be provided in every camp site or ground here-tofore or hereafter established one or more slop sinks properly connected with a sewer or septic tank, such sinks to be conveniently located at no greater distance than one hundred feet from any camp automobile and/or trailer.

Section 21. It shall be unlawful to permit any waste water or material from sinks, baths, showers or other plumbing fixtures in camp automobiles and/or trailers to be deposited upon the surface of the ground and all such fixtures when in use must be connected to the city sewer system, or the drainage therefrom must be disposed of in a manner satisfactory to the Health Department.

Section 22. Every camp site or ground heretofore or hereafter established shall be provided with means of lighting the same at night, and all public water closets and bath units shall be provided with sufficient lighting facilition which shall be kept lighted during the time from one-half after sunset until one-half hour before sunrises.

Section 23. Any water faucet, toilets, garbage receptacles, or other equipment required by a provisions of this ordinance in camp grounds or camp sites which may hereafter be required by any rules and regulations of the Health Department pertaining to camp sites or grounds shall not be construed to mean faucets, toilets, garbage receptacles or other equipment now or hereafter located in or adjacent to camp sites or grounds which may already be required under provisions of other laws or ordinances.

Section 24. Every person, firm or corporation violating or contributing in any way to the violation of any provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each day during which such violating continues and shall be punishable therefor as herein provided. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 25. It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation owning, leasing, renting or operating a camp site or ground in the County of James City to comply with all of the provisions of this ordinance and/or rules and regulations formulated by the health Department governing camp sites or grounds, and any such person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or said rules and regulations or contributing in any way to the violation thereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars or by imprisonment in the County jail not exceeding six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 26. If any section, sub-section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional such decision shall not affect the violidity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Board hereby declares that it would have passed the ordinance and and each section, sub-section, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, sub-section, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional.

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING A LICENSE TO BE OBTAINED BY AND IMPOSING A LICENSE TAX UPON EVERY PERSON, FIRM, CORPORATION AND ASSOCIATION WHO OR WHICH OPERATES IN THE COUNTY OF JAMES CITY, VIRGINIA. A TRAILER CAMP AS HEREIN DEFINED, THE CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH SUCH LICENSE MAY BE OBTAINED, THE PERIOD FOR WHICH IT SHALL BE EFFECTIVE WHICH PERIOD MAY BE FOR A FULL YEAR OR ANY PART THEREOF AND PRESCRIBING THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF SUCH ORDINANCE TO BE IMPOSED BY THE COURT TRYING THE CASE.

Be it ordained by the Board of Supervisors of James City County, Virginia, as follows:

1. - That on and after the date that this ordinance goes into effect, any person, firm, corporation or association who or which operates in the County of James City, Virginia, a trailer camp, as defined in Chapter 256 of "Code of Virginia, Acts of Assembly, of 1942," will first obtain the license required herein by making written application to the Commissioner of Revenue of Said County, and it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association to operate such trailer camp without first obtaining such license.

2. - It is hereby imposed on any such person, firm, corporation or association who operates a trailer camp in the County of James City, Virginia, an annual license tax of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each trailer site, to be parked or placed accommodated at such camp.

- 3. The annual license hereunder may be prorated and granted for less than a year, and the tax thereon shall bear such proportion to the whole annual tax as the space of time between granting the same and the thirty-first of December following bears to the whole year; but no license shall be granted for a period of less than three (3) months.
- 4. For the purpose of this ordinance, a trailer shall mean any vehicle used or constructed for use as a conveyance upon highways, so designed and so constructed as to permit occupancy thereof as a dwelling or sleeping place for one or more persons.
- 5. Every such license obtained hereunder shall be posted in some conspicuous place within the trailer camp obtaining same so that any law enforcement officer may inspect the license.
- 6. All such licenses obtained hereunder from the Commissioner of Revenue of James City County Virginia, shall state the definite place of business, the full name of applicant, the residence of the applicant, the residence address of the applicant, the number of trailers in the trailer camp, and shall be made in duplicate on the forms prescribed by the said Commissioner of Revenue.

Every application for such license shall have incorporated therein or annexed thereto the affidavit of the applicant to the effect that the statements contained in application are true. If the applicant be an individual, the affidavit must be by him if a firm, by one of his members, and if a corporation, by the office having knowledge of the correctness the statements made in the application. Upon the receipt of such application for a license, the Commissioner of the Revenue, if satisfied of its correctness, shall compute the tax prescribed herein, and shall issue the license to the applicant. No license issued by the Commissioner of the Revenue hereunder, shall be valid or have any legal effect unless and until the tax prescribed herein shall have been paid to the Treasurer of James City County, Virginia, and the fact of such payment shall appear on the face of the license.

All the license tax collected under the terms of this ordinance shall be turned over to the county Treasurer of James City County and be credited by him to the general County Fund.

7. - Any person, firm, corporation or association who violates the provisions of this ordinance or fails or refuses to obtain the required license shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not less than Twenty Dollar (\$20.00) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and each day of failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, or failure or refusal to obtain the required license, shall be deemed a separate offense.

All fines and costs collected under the terms of this ordinance shall be turned over to the Treasurer of Treasurer of James City County and be credited by him to the General County Fund. Cost shall be taxed in prosecution under this ordinance in the same amounts and in the same manner as is prescribed by the law in misdemeanor cases under State statutes. All costs collected under this ordinance shall be disbursed in the manner as is prescribed by law in misdemeanor cases under the State statutes.

WHEREAS, This Board has been advised that the League of Virginia Counties will propose at the 1944 Session of the General Assembly legislation amending the present statute laws of Virginia pertaining to annexation to provide the following provisions in the annexation laws:

- 1. That the citizens of an area proposed for annexation be granted the right to vote on the proposal before annexation can become effective.
- 2. That the statute of limitations should be extended to ten (10) years.
- 3. That the city may not increase the tax rate nor the assessed valuations within the annexed area for a period of five (5) years after the annexation

decree becomes effective.

- 4. That all annexation procedure be postponed until one year after the war.
- 5. Recommend passage of Senate Bill 215 which was considered during the 1942 session of the General Assembly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board, on motion of W. C. Martin duly seconded and unanimously adopted, doth urge the passage by the General Assembly of Virginia of legislation carrying out the above recommendations of the League of Virginia Counties pertaining to the amendment of the annexation laws of this State.

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that the Clerk of this Board be and he hereby is directed to certify copies of the foregoing resolution to the members of the General Assembly representing this County, with the request that they notify this Board whether they will or will not support legislation substantially carrying out the above recommendations of the League of Virginia Counties.
