- I Voted stickers New I Voted stickers for voters and youth have been designed and ordered from a new vendor that is charging less than the previous vendor. In 2026, there will be a custom sticker commemorating James City County's 250th anniversary.
- November Ballot Approval_ The ballots have been submitted to the Virginia Department of Elections for approval. There are four unique ballot groups.
- Tents Ms. Moorman is working with JCC for tent placement. The party chairs will be present when drawing for location takes place. There will be one tent for independent candidates.
- Classes Information about training classes for election officers will be available this
 week.
- Logic and Accuracy Testing (L&A Testing)
 - OVO and OVI Friday, September 12 at 9 a.m. (Vote Center)
 - Mini High-Speed Scanner Friday, September 26 at 9 a.m. (Mtg Room A)
- Registered Voters The number of registered voters continues to grow. As of 8/1/2025, there were 65,473 registered voters.
- New Equipment Four space heaters have been ordered for use at precincts that turn off the heat on Election Day. A podium has been ordered for the Vote Center.

<u>Voter Registrars Association of Virginia (VRAV)</u> – Ms. Moorman and the Chief Deputy Coordinator attended the VRAV Annual Meeting on August 3-6 in Roanoke. Ms. Moorman is an at-large member of the VRAV Executive Committee.

<u>Vote Center Emergency Door</u> – Ms. Moorman has sent a letter to JCC General Services with copies of letters from Homeland Security, JCC Police and JCC Risk Management supporting the request for an Emergency Door from the Vote Center room.

Motion: Ms. Matthews moved the Electoral Board formally request and urge James City County to install an emergency exit from the Vote Center Room for security and safety purposes. Dr. Stoldt seconded the motion that passed unanimously.
