C. LIAISON REPORTS

Due to lack of quorum, Ms. Bledsoe started with Liaison Reports, beginning with Workforce Development.

Ms. Sipes summarized the efforts of the Workforce Development Resource Team, a collaboration between James City County Economic Development, Thomas Nelson Community College and Williamsburg-James City County (WJCC) Schools. Ms. Sipes explained the team was using ChefsGO as a model and gathering input directly from the employers in the area by sector. Beginning with healthcare, the group has a short survey scheduled to go out electronically and a meeting scheduled for March to discuss challenges and potential solutions. The intent is to follow with a similar effort aimed at the trades and manufacturing sector.

Ms. Bledsoe updated the EDA regarding Business Liaison activities, indicating she and Mr. Maddocks had met recently with members of the local Service Corps of Retired Executives (S.C.O.R.E.) chapter. She also mentioned they had provided folders with information about S.C.O.R.E. services for anyone who was interested.

Ms. Bledsoe also reported on Workforce Housing Task Force activities. She referred to information on the recommendations by the Task Force that were included in the EDA packet.

ADOPTED FEB 1 9 2019 Mr. Tingle reported for GO Virginia, sharing a presentation on the RVA-Hampton Roads Collaboration Initiative. While not related directly to GO Virginia efforts, he explained the regional effort to build a case for more formal collaboration between Hampton Roads and Richmond regions. Mr. Tingle shared some of the advantages of a potential collaboration, including the shared assets and challenges of the two regions and the impact of a region that ranks 17th largest in the nation as compared to the current ranking of 43rd and 39th for Richmond and Hampton Roads respectively.

D. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Bledsoe asked if there were any questions for Ms. Jordan, based on the report provided in the packet.

Ms. Jordan indicated Mr. Turner had submitted questions via email, which she wanted to address. Mr. Turner's first question was whether the Board of Supervisors had appointed anyone to the newly created Eastern Virginia Regional Industrial Facility Authority. Ms. Jordan indicated no appointments had yet been made.

Ms. Jordan shared Mr. Turner's second question, whether the interactions with Ft. Eustis are leveraging meaningful opportunities. Ms. Jordan responded staff is advancing that relationship and is confident future possibilities will arise.

Ms. Jordan shared Mr. Turner's last question about the work of the Hampton Roads Planning District Commission (HRPDC), specifically regional obstacles, opportunities or emerging trends. Ms. Jordan referred to Mr. Tingle's presentation earlier in the meeting.

Mr. Tingle noted the communication with Ft. Eustis was positive. He also asked if the James River Commerce Center management contract was still in place, with the change in ownership of the available land.

Ms. Jordan responded affirmatively, the same company was still providing management services.

E. OLD BUSINESS

Ms. Bledsoe summarized the efforts of the Directors at the Retreat in December by identifying areas of focus that include workforce development efforts, Opportunity Zone and the development of additional incentives.
