THE MEETING WAS HELD ELECTRONICALLY PURSUANT TO THE CONTINUITY OF GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE ADOPTED ON APRIL 14, 2020, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JAMES CITY COUNTY, VIRGINIA.

THE MEETING WAS CONDUCTED VIA ZOOM WITH PUBLIC ACCESS PROVIDED THROUGH INTERNET AUDIO AND VIDEO, AS WELL AS TELEPHONIC AUDIO. COMMENTS ON AGENDA ITEMS WERE ACCEPTED BY EMAIL SUBMISSION TO THE EDA SECRETARY.

A. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Campana called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

Mr. Hlavin introduced a resolution addressing the fact that the meeting was being held in an electronic format pursuant to the Continuity of Government Ordinance adopted by the Board of Supervisors due to social distancing guidelines issued in response to the COVID-19 outbreak.

1. Enter Closed Session

Mr. Campana moved to go into Closed Session in accordance with the Code of Virginia for the purposes of: 1) discussion concerning a prospective business or industry or the expansion of an existing business or industry where no previous announcement has been made of the interest in locating or expanding its facilities in the community pursuant to Va. Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(5); 2) the investment of public funds to incentivize relocating or expanding companies where competition or bargaining is involved where, if made public initially, the financial interest of the Authority and the County would be adversely affected pursuant to Va. Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(6); 3) discussion or consideration of the disposition of publicly held real property located at 8925 Columbia Drive, where discussion in an open meeting would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the Authority pursuant to Va. Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(3); 4) discussion or consideration of proprietary information related to economic development, voluntarily provided by private business pursuant to a promise of confidentiality from the Authority and used for business development and retention pursuant to Va. Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(39); and 5) consultation with legal counsel retained by the Authority regarding specific legal matters related to agreements and property owned by the Authority requiring the provision of legal advice by such counsel pursuant to Va. G. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Nice informed the EDA that after discussing his business relationship in Billsburg Brewery with EDA Legal Counsel, he will not be participating in the discussion regarding the Marina Property or the discussion regarding Billsburg Brewery Improvements.

Mr. Tingle informed the EDA that he will not be participating in the discussion regarding the Marina Property; while Legal Counsel has determined he has no legal conflict, he acknowledges a perception of conflict and has chosen to not participate.

1. Marina Property

A motion to enter into a supplemental agreement with Billsburg Brewery was made by Carlton Stockton; motion Passed. AYES: 5 NAYS: 0 ABSTAIN: 2 ABSENT: 0 Ayes: Campana, Meredith, Stanko, Stockton, Turner Abstain: Nice, Tingle

As a result of discussion in Closed Session and at the request of Billsburg Brewery, the tenant at the Marina property managed by the EDA, Mr. Johnson presented a request to modify the supplemental agreement with Billsburg Brewery that was approved by the EDA in May. The modifications were to change the months of deferred rent from May, June, and July 2020 to July, August, and September 2020 at the request of the tenant.

2. Billsburg Brewery Improvements

A motion to support Billsburg Brewery in the effort to create additional storage space on site was made by William Turner; motion Passed. AYES: 5 NAYS: 0 ABSTAIN: 2 ABSENT: 0 Ayes: Campana, Meredith, Stanko, Stockton, Turner Abstain: Nice, Tingle

Mr. Johnson introduced Billsburg Brewery's plan to submit a site plan for approximately 300 square feet of storage behind the existing warehouse. Mr. Johnson explained the additional space will be used for either empty keg storage or cold storage, making room inside the warehouse available for a canning line to be installed. Mr. Johnson explained the lease does require the tenant to obtain approval from the EDA for certain proposed improvements.

3. <u>Enterprise Zone Grants</u>

A motion to approve the annual Enterprise Zone payments was made by Tom Tingle; motion Passed.

Ms. Sipes presented the annual list of Enterprise Zone incentive recipients, reminding the EDA the grants were based on a five-year declining schedule. Ms. Sipes noted that changes in the legislation prohibited new grants due to the expiration of the state designation, and a new local incentive program would be needed to continue similar benefits after the presented projects received all five years of the grant. Ms. Sipes also reminded the EDA the incentive dollars would be transferred to the EDA from the County's General Fund and checks to the qualifying companies would be sent from the EDA.

H. OLD BUSINESS

1. Revised Draft Budget - Fiscal Year 2021

A motion to approve the revised draft budget as amended was made by Lynn Meredith; motion Passed. AYES: 7 NAYS: 0 ABSTAIN: 0 ABSENT: 0 Ayes: Campana, Meredith, Nice, Stanko, Stockton, Tingle, Turner

Ms. Sipes presented a revised draft EDA budget reflecting the discussion at the April EDA meeting. Ms. Sipes noted the changes in the Marina Property (from \$59,941 to \$49,173) and Cash Reserves (from \$18,962 to \$29,730) Revenue line items as a result of the action taken earlier in the meeting with regard to the Marina Property tenant, thereby amending the revised budget.

Mr. Tingle stated his support for a review of the Fiscal Year 2020 budget versus year-end actual in the coming months.

2. Columbia Drive Repairs

Ms. Sipes summarized minor construction that was recently completed on Columbia Drive as one of the final steps to have the road and rights-of-way accepted by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) as a state-maintained road. Ms. Sipes explained that Columbia Drive has been a privately-owned street since it was completed and much effort has been made in recent years to have the street become a public street, noting the EDA owns the parcel at the end of Columbia Drive and has been marketing the property for industrial development for years. As a private street owned by the EDA, staff had recently arranged for a chain to be placed across the street to limit access from idle semi-trucks. Ms. Sipes explained that upon completion of the needed repairs, the EDA would need to have a new gate or chain installed at the end of the street on EDA property in order to prevent unauthorized access and dumping on the property. Ms. Sipes noted no action was required at this time, but staff would return with cost estimates for access control measures.

J. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Johnson updated the EDA on the Greater Williamsburg Business Assistance Fund in partnership with the Virginia 30-Day Fund, noting the \$10,000 in seed money provided by the EDAs of York County, James City County, and the City of Williamsburg had now exceeded \$50,000 due to private leveraged contributions. Mr. Johnson also noted the Board of Supervisors had voted in May to contribute \$500,000 for James City County businesses, expanding the fund even further.

Mr. Johnson also reminded the EDA of the discussion to offer some recognition to those companies and individuals who participated in the inaugural overseas marketing mission to Germany in February.

Mr. Tingle noted a Resolution of Appreciation and some public recognition should be offered for their willingness to take the time to represent our region.

Mr. Johnson indicated staff would make some preparations and return to the EDA at a future meeting.
