Ms. Meredith asked for an explanation of the bad debt expense on the expenditure report.

Mr. Wiggins responded that two cure payments had been received in November 2022 from OKS Systems and MODU for two forgivable loans issued by the EDA over a decade ago, effectively resulting in the remainder written off per the agreement. Writing off the remainder of the loan as a bad debt expense does not result in any additional funds being spent and is an accounting procedure to acknowledge that the obligation was paid in full.

## G. OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Johnson provided an update on the maintenance project at the James City County Marina and reported that the project was proceeding ahead of schedule with the beam replacements to stabilize the second floor Taproom for Billsburg Brewery having been completed and a Certificate of Occupancy inspection scheduled for January 18, 2023. Mr. Johnson added that the General Manager for Billsburg was pleased with the speed of the work and would be discussing a potential request for partial rent abatement with his Board which would be presented for EDA consideration when it is received.

## H. LIAISON REPORTS

There were no liaison reports. Mr. Johnson stated that the Eastern Virginia Regional Industrial Facility Authority (EVRIFA) appointments made in 2019 were set to expire this year. A memorandum will be on the Board of Supervisors February 14 Agenda to reappoint Ms. Sue Sadler and Mr. Campana as primary EVRIFA members and Mr. Jason Purse and Mr. Johnson as alternate EVRIFA members.

## I. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Johnson referred to the report in the Agenda Packet noting an item that was not included in the report was a press release from the Governor's Office on Monday, February 16, announcing that James City County had been awarded a \$485,500 grant through the Virginia Business Ready Sites Program or due diligence studies required to elevate the Hazelwood Farms Enterprise Center property to a Tier 4 and complete design work for water and sanitary sewer extensions from La Grange Parkway in the Stonehouse Commerce Park to Old Stage Road that would make the property "shovel ready" within 12-18 months. The County was one of only 21 localities in the Commonwealth to receive a grant award in a highly competitive process that saw over \$400,000,000 in projects submitted for \$85,000,000 in available funding.

#### D. FINANCIAL REPORTS

Mr. Wiggins presented the revenue and expense reports and informed the EDA the cash balance was approximately \$750,000 following the receipt of the Williamsburg Landing annual bond administration fee.

Mr. Johnson stated that he had a conversation with the Assistant County Treasurer Cameron Boone as a follow-up to discussion at the January 17, 2023, meeting regarding potential investment options available to the EDA. Mr. Johnson stated that he would invite

County Treasurer Jenni Tomes or Mr. Boone to attend the March 21, 2023, meeting to discuss the options available to use the cash balance to earn additional revenue.

#### E. CLOSED SESSION

## F. NEW BUSINESS

#### 1. James City County Marina

A motion to Approve the February 2023 Billsburg Brewery rent abatement request for \$3,000 was made by William Turner; motion Passed. AYES: 4 NAYS: 0 ABSTAIN: 1 ABSENT: 2 Ayes: Gajda, Meredith, Campana, Turner Abstain: Nice Absent: Mulvain, Stanko

Mr. Nice stated that based on discussion with the County Attorney, his position on the Board of Directors represents a conflict of interest and he would be abstaining from participating in the discussion and any vote related to Billsburg Brewery and left the room.

Mr. Eric Williams, General Manager of Billsburg Brewery, summarized a written request for partial abatement of February rent based on the impact to operations created by construction in the Marina building causing the Taproom to be shut down for over half of January 2023. Mr. Williams stated that year over year revenues were higher in 2023 but that was the result of having added heaters to the patio, the addition of the Pavilion, and unseasonably mild weather in what is traditionally the slowest month at the Brewery. Several military retirement parties and a William & Mary Alumni Association event had to be cancelled because of the Taproom closure which resulted in the loss of \$1,000 rental fee for each event and lost sales revenue.

Mr. Johnson stated that the requested abatement of \$3,000 represents approximately 52% of the monthly Billsburg rent and is a reasonable request given the impact on operations resulting from the County-initiated construction project.

Ms. Meredith asked if the completion of construction would allow an increased capacity in the Taproom.

Mr. Williams confirmed that the Taproom capacity would now allow up to 50 patrons.

Ms. Meredith asked if the Brewery was current on its rent.

Mr. Johnson confirmed that it is current through January 2023 but had not paid February rent pending the outcome of the requested abatement. If a motion to approve the abatement request were to pass, Mr. Johnson stated that a revised invoice would be sent to Mr. Williams with payment due by the end of the month.

Hearing no further questions, Ms. Gajda thanked Mr. Williams for his cooperation and coordination with County General Services staff prior to and during construction and was pleased to hear those operations had returned to normal, and the outlook appeared promising given the increased number of events that are scheduled in the coming months.

Mr. Nice returned to the room.

## 2. Williamsburg-Jamestown Airport Expansion

Mr. Johnson summarized recent conversations with County Administration about a potential use of EDA reserve funds for an incentive grant that would facilitate an expansion of the T-hangars at the Williamsburg-Jamestown Airport.

A general discussion ensued where Directors asked questions regarding the history of previous EDA incentive agreements and forgivable loans to support existing industry expansions, the legal construct of a potential agreement, and the development of parameters to better define the circumstances where EDA reserve funds should be considered for incentives. The Directors agreed that more information was needed and asked that staff bring the item back at their next meeting for further consideration.

# H. LIAISON REPORTS

Mr. Johnson stated that on February 14, 2023, the Board of Supervisors reappointed Ms. Sadler and Mr. Campana as primary members for the Eastern Virginia Regional Industrial Facility Authority (EVRIFA) and Mr. Jason Purse and Mr. Johnson as alternate EVRIFA members, each to a four-year term.

# I. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Johnson referred to the report in the Agenda Packet referencing the Virginia Business Ready Sites Program grant to increase the site readiness of the Hazelwood Farms Enterprise Center and the status of a Deed of Exchange that needs to be signed and recorded before a closing date can be scheduled for the sale of 8930 Columbia Drive in the James River Commerce Center.

SUBJECT:	Williamsburg-Jamestown Airport Expansion

At our last meeting on February 21, 2023, I provided a brief introduction for a proposed expansion at the Williamsburg-Jamestown Airport and recent communication with County Administration about an incentive agreement using EDA funds to spur the construction of additional T-Hangars at the Airport.

The goal of any potential incentive is that it will produce positive, measurable benefits for the County. When the County has provided incentives in the past, a performance agreement is executed that would tie the incentive to a measurable outcome. The incentive becomes a forgivable loan once those standards are met (i.e., the County receives a commensurate amount of tax revenue over time, makes a defined number of new hires, etc.)

County Administration envisions the EDA using its available funding to offer these types of incentives as an innovative way to create revenue. Using its funds to incentivize development in existing industries and target market sectors makes sense from the mission of the EDA, as well as furthers interests of the County. While County Administration cannot guarantee future revenue coming back to the EDA in perpetuity, I believe it would make sense to use these types of projects to create funding streams for future EDA projects. In this instance, there is support to utilize a new process where the monitoring of the forgivable grant becomes tied into a funding request from the EDA in future years, where a portion of the personal property tax revenues which result from additional aircraft being housed in the T-Hangers can be returned to the EDA to help fund additional projects.

Any incentive for the Williamsburg Airport should be viewed based on a measurable benefit to the County. It is true, that there is an amount of money that the Airport owes the County from bringing Marclay Road into the public system, but that is entirely exclusive from this potential incentive. The County has separate agreements with the Airport for this money and should not be considered. However, I will note that in conversations with the Airport it was made clear that they would not be able to pay back the amount owed AND build the T-Hangers at the same time. In this instance, an incentive grant would allow the Airport to both pay back the County and build the T-Hangers, which is a benefit to the County and Airport.

**Small Business Relief Grant Program** - Staff is collaborating with the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development to finalize compliance review of the now closed grant program. All \$900,000 was distributed to 71 County small businesses.

**James River Commerce Center** - Economic Development Authority counsel continues to work with Ball Corporation counsel to resolve a title exception issue. Once the Deed of Exchange has been signed and recorded, closing on the 58-acre property at 8930 Columbia Drive will be scheduled as soon as possible.

**Virginia Business Ready Sites Program** - The \$485,500 in grant funding announced by the Governor in January will support the Board of Supervisors' adopted Capital Improvements Program funding to conduct due diligence studies and design and engineering of water and sanitary sewer extensions to serve the Hazelwood Farms Enterprise Center development. A performance agreement will be executed between the Commonwealth of Virginia and the County in the coming weeks.
